Mrs Audrey Kempton (Borderbrook)

Our Judge today Mrs Audrey Kempton has been involved in Border Collies for over 30 years, admiring Borders while she was still at school. She attended the Dundee Alsatian and Training Club in the evenings, participating in the demonstration team for agility and also trained in obedience.

Audrey bought her first 'proper' Border Collie from Working / Show lines in 1981 and purchased a bitch the following year which started her journey in the show ring, and as they say, the rest is history

Audrey bred her first litter in 1983, keeping a dog and a bitch. Having had some success, she took a break from the show ring to concentrate on her young family. Audrey returned to the ring in 1990 but it was in 1993 that 'The girl of her dreams' came into her life, Brook, a beautiful, stunning lady from a much admired girl who she adored, Lovey - Image of Love at Clan-Abby, from the Wizaland Kennels. DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate, includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members Classes or competing for Members Specials, each partner must at the time of entry, be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class. i.e. **Friday, 25th January 2019**.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes, but when entering Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special prize, of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options

(1) *Withdrawal*

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 20.

(2) *Transfer*

- a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

NOVICE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not)..

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL OPEN COLOUR As Open, but confined to dogs of any colour, other than Black and White.

ADVISORY NOTICE

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed. **NFC entries can only be accepted for dogs of four calendar months of age and over on the day of the Show.**

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 9.30 am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time, but it is the Exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 10.30 am (*please note that there will be one ring in use and bitch judging will take place after completion of the dog judging*).
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. **Entry fees: Members** - 1st Entry £4.50 per dog. **Non Members** - 1st Entry £5.00 per dog. All Subsequent entries with the same dog 50p per class. Not for Competition: Free of charge. Catalogues: pre-paid with entries £2.00 (a limited number are available on the day at £2.50). Rosette Sponsorship: £2.00 per class. Membership: £3.00 Single; £4.50 Joint; £1.50 Senior/Junior. **All Memberships run from January to December each year.**
6. No Prize Money is on offer at this show.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under 6 months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.

10. **Best Puppy in Show**

Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.

11. **Best in Show**

Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.

12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch to the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F I I.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulations F (Annex B): Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT**

RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show
18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered. N.B. Not for Competition entries can only be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months of age and over on the day of the Show.
19. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.
20. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This Regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).
21. The show will be held under Kennel Club Rules and Show Regulations. Every Exhibitor making an entry or entries at this show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by these Rules and Regulations and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
22. Exhibitors/Handlers are responsible for clearing up and removing any loose hair or fouling from dogs in their charge, or any other litter, whether from the car park, the exercise area or any other part of the venue.
23. Parents/Guardians please note that well behaved children are welcome, but those in charge of children will be held fully responsible for their actions within the environs of the show.
24. A dog may be disqualified by the Board of the Kennel Club from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge. This shall not apply in the case of a judge appointed in an emergency.
25. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.
26. No unentered dogs are allowed within the confines of the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches.

CLEANLINESS Please note that this venue is a church building and we are therefore very fortunate to be able to use these facilities! Help us to retain this venue for dogs shows in the future, by only exercising your animals in the designated areas and by cleaning up after your dog at all times. Any exhibitor found to be abusing these rules will be reported to the Kennel Club and barred from future entry to our shows.

DOG FOULING F8 (a) Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible, any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club Licensed show, within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event, including the car and caravan parks and approaches. The society will arrange for the dispersal of suitable receptacles to assist with the compliance of regulation F8(a).

ATTRACTION OF EXHIBITS F(1) 17f. The attracting of exhibits by any method from outside the ring is prohibited. It is the duty of the Judge, Steward or Show Management noticing such attraction to ask that it cease.

• DIRECTIONS TO THE VENUE •

THE POSTCODE FOR THE VENUE IS CH5 1QD

From the South:

Take the M6, then M54 towards Telford, then follow A5 to Oswestry. Follow A483 to Chester. Before reaching Chester take A55 towards Queensferry on to the A494. Keep following the signs for Queensferry and go down the hill into the 50 mph zone. *

Leave this road at the signs for the “B5219” Queensferry/Shotton (the junction has a large sign for “Karting”). At the roundabout at the bottom of the slip road follow Queensferry/Shotton (ASDA is on the left hand side). **

Go through the traffic lights following the signs for Flint. Shotton is about 1 mile along road. Go past the ESSO petrol station (on your left) and turn left at the next set of Traffic Lights. The venue is on the left hand side at rear of Church.

From the West:

Pick up the A55 as appropriate and head towards Chester, follow this road until it becomes the A494. When you pick up the signs for Queensferry follow directions as **“From the South”** (* above).

From the North (and North Wales):

Take the M6, then M56 and follow this towards North Wales. Leave the M56 at the signs for Queensferry/Shotton, on to the A494. Follow these signs proceeding onto a dual carriageway (and then into a 50 mph zone). Take the slip road for Queensferry/Shotton (the junction has a large sign for “Karting”). Take the 4th exit off roundabout, towards Queensferry/Shotton (the “B5219” - ASDA is on the left hand side).

When you pick up the signs for Queensferry follow directions as **“From the South”** (** above).
