DOGS ON HOT DAYS IN VEHICLES

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic.

If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.

The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.

Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.

When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.

Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise.

~ OUR JUDGES ~

Julie Joyce (Janjujons)

At the age of 11 years my father bought my first Stafford, Sooty, (Midnight Moll), a black brindle, in 1984. She wasn't what most people called show quality but I loved her with all my heart and instantly fell in love with showing.

In 1986, Sooty had a litter and we kept a black and white pied, Sweep (Frontier Finders Boy). My Nan had his brother Ben (Ridgeway Top Sarjeant), a black brindle. Both dogs had an excellent show career. Ben went on to become Southern Counties SBTS's top dog in 1988, winning six trophies at the annual awards. Sooty also won three trophies that year too. We then bought a lovely red bitch, Susie (Ashstock Oyster Pearl) in 1988 and had loads of fun showing her. In 1991 Susie had a litter and again we kept a dog, a big black brindle called Butch (Janjujons Jumping Jack Flash). He also did very well at the shows and won several trophies at the Staffordshire Bull Terrier Club at their annual awards. Susie also won trophies.

At the age of 16 I joined the committee of the Southern Counties SBTS and by the age of 17 I became Show Manager, following in my father's footsteps. I was also on the committee for Tooting Ringcraft at the same time.

At the tender age of 18 I judged my first show with my father as steward. I was nervous but enjoyed it nonetheless. I had a few years out of the ring as in 1996 I had my only son, but by 2003 I was back doing what I love most.

In 2004, I started to show my father's black brindle bitch Tammy (Gadkeys Just Joan). Anyone who knows her will know that is no easy heat as she is rather fiery.

2006 saw the arrival of Tammy's son Bouncer (Jollyjons Last One Standing). That was not an easy whelp and there were many complications. I took to showing Bouncer and even did some fun shows with him winning Best in Show.

I then got Freya (Dynastaff She's a Devil) in 2012 as a Christmas present from my father. She has, to date, had a fantastic show career and achieved much more than her predecessors.

In between Staffords I have had four rescue dogs, all Stafford crosses, and I still have one now called Sweenie, who is a Stafford cross Basenji. He has done brilliantly at fun shows and won Best in Show at seven months old.

In 2015 I mated Freya with Ch Bullrichs Bismarck at Crossguns and produced two tiger brindles and a mahogany brindle.

I have no colour bias and treat every dog equally when presented under me.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Saturday, 26th January 2019.** Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

- (I) Withdrawal
 - The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 20.
- (2) Transfer
 - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. **PUPPY** For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

NOVICE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than 7 years of age on the first day of the Show.

ADVISORY NOTICE

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

RULES and REGULATIONS •

- I. The Show will open at 1.30 pm.
- Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging will commence at 2.00 pm prompt.

- Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5. Entry Fees: Members £5.00 per dog (unlimited classes). Non-Members £5.50 per dog (unlimited classes). Veteran Classes FREE entry. Not for Competition: Free for Registered Staffords only. Spectator Dogs: £2.50 per dog. Catalogues: £2.00 pre-paid with entries (£3.00 on the day). Membership (Renewals only): Single or Joint £6.00. Advertisements: £5.00 Full Page; £3.00 Half Page. Class Sponsorship £5.00 per class.
- 6. There is no Prize Money on offer at this show.
- 7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 10. Best Puppy in Show

Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.

11. Best in Show

Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.

- 12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them <u>nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move</u>. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation FII.
- 14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 15. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 16. Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. 17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.

- 18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- 19. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- 20. All postal entries must be made on or before SATURDAY, 2nd February 2019 (Postmark, 1st Class) and On-line entries can be made up until midnight on SUNDAY, 10th FEBRUARY 2019. Each exhibitor must use a separate entry form.
- 21. All dogs at the time of entry for a Show shall be solely and unconditionally the property of the exhibitor and must at the time of exhibition be registered in the name of the exhibitor at the Kennel Club.
- 22. The Committee are empowered to exclude any vicious dog or any dog which is not in a fit state for exhibition either from disease, vice, natural or other causes and if any such exclusion takes place either before or after the dog is judged the entry fee shall be forfeited.
- 23. A Judge shall be empowered to withhold any award, if, in his opinion there is lack of sufficient merit.
- 24. The committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of all dogs entered for exhibition and for any property entrusted to it, but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and any other persons that the committee will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss, or detention of, or damage to any dog or person for any cause whatsoever, nor for any act of omission of themselves, their officers, servants, agents and others, and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
- 25. Should a judge be prevented from fulfilling his/her engagement the Committee reserves to itself the right of appointing another judge to fulfill the duty. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from the competition but no entry fees can be refunded.
- No dogs other than an exhibit shall be brought into the precincts of a dog show while the Show is being held.
- 27. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.
- 28. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This Regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).
