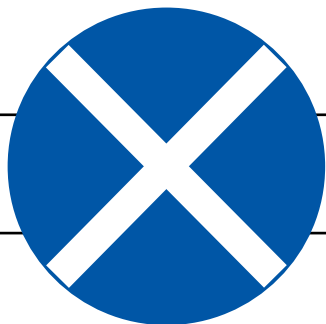

Special stewards will be on duty in an effort to ensure that the foregoing requirements are carried out and the dog-showing public is encouraged to assist by active participation and by reporting those who fail in their responsibilities to the Show Management and, if necessary, the Kennel Club.

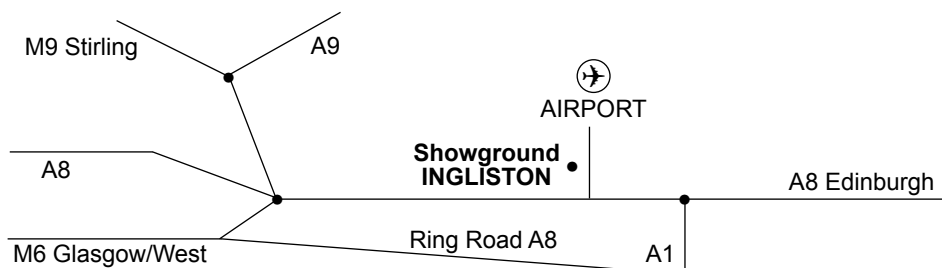
VENUE OF CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW

The venue for our thirty-eighth Championship Show is again the spacious Highland Hall at the Royal Highland Showground, Ingliston, Edinburgh. All breeds will be on the ground level and there will be Trade Stands offering a wide variety of merchandise.

Catering and bar facilities are included.

Parking facilities are available for cars and coaches adjacent to the Hall.

RULES & REGULATIONS

Vicious dogs are not eligible and must not be brought to the Show
Exhibitors are held responsible for any damage done by their dog during the exhibition.

1. The Show will open at 7.30 am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 9.00 am unless otherwise advised.
4. The Show will close half an hour after judging has been completed by which time dogs must be removed. Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. Exhibits may not be removed any earlier unless by written order of the Veterinary Surgeon, Veterinary Practitioner or of the Show Management and then only in very exceptional and unforeseen circumstances which must be reported to the Kennel Club.
5. Entry fees: Breeds Where CCs are on offer: First class with each dog: Members £26.00, Non-Members £27.00. Each subsequent class with the same dog £4.00. Non-CC Breeds: First entry each dog: Members £11.00, Non-Members £12.00. £4.00 each subsequent class. Stakes Classes as a first entry: £12.00 per class. YKC Members' Stakes/YKC Members' Handling Classes £12.00 as a first entry. Brace: £4.00 per class. KC Breeders' Competition: £12.00 per team. Not For Competition: £12.00 per dog. Car Parking £5.00 payable on the day.
6. Prize Money will not be paid with the exception of certain Stakes classes (see classification for details).
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **Best Puppy in Show:** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed, Best of Group or Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best of Breed, Reserve Best in Group or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group or Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show respectively.
 - a. Championship Shows Judged on the Group System (Definition; Shows judged on Group System - Refer to Regulation 27.b.)
 - 1) Best Puppy in Breed:
A Best Puppy must be declared in each breed from puppies entered in the Breed Classes.
A Best AVNSC Puppy must be declared from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes.
A Best Puppy must be declared from the Any Variety Imported Breed Register classes.
 - 2) Best Puppy in Group: Best Puppy in Group and subsequent Puppy Group placings must be selected from:-
 - a) Those puppies declared Best Puppy in Breed.
 - b) The puppy declared Best Puppy from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes on each day.
 - c) The puppy declared Best Puppy from the Any Variety Imported Breed Register classes on each day.
11. **Best in Show:** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and has been declared Best in Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register.
Definition of a Category 3 Breed. A breed from time to time designated by the Board as requiring particular monitoring by reason of visible condition(s) which may cause health or welfare concerns. The list of designated Category 3 Breeds is kept under regular review.
 - 1) Best of Breed: Where a breed is separately classified a Best of Breed may be declared but only from those dogs which have received a first prize in a breed class at the show. Where separate classes are provided for each sex of a breed a Best of each Sex must be declared.
NOTE: The Best of Breed/Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified/Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register award relevant to a Category 3 will not be confirmed until the dog has passed an examination by the General and Group Championship Show Veterinary Surgeon. If the dog fails to pass the examination it is ineligible to compete in the relevant Group.
 - 2) Best in Show: Best in Show must be selected from the Best of Group winners. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Group winners following the selection of Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show and Best Puppy in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.

13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) — Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at Kennel Club licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade — take your own shade, for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK, FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**
17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
18. Not For Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
19. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
20. The Show will be held under Kennel Club Limited Rules and Show Regulations.
21. Receipt of Postal Entries. Correctly postmarked entries received after 3rd October 2018 will be accepted but will not be included in the Catalogue. If acknowledgement of entries is required, an addressed, stamped card with "Receipt" written on the reverse should be enclosed. In your own interests use FIRST CLASS MAIL. The only proof of posting of entries acceptable to the Committee is the Certificate of Posting issued free by the Post Office, Recorded Delivery or Registered Post.
22. The exercise area for dogs will be outside but within the curtilage of the Exhibition Hall and access will be obtained via the Main Foyer (West).
23. All dogs must be brought with a suitable strong chain and collar properly fastened on the dog.
24. The Committee is empowered to exclude any dog which is not in a fit state for exhibition from disease, vice, natural or other causes, and if such exclusion takes place before or after the dog is judged, the entry fee will be forfeited.
25. The Catalogues, which can be purchased on the day, will contain the owners' names in each breed in alphabetical order, with dogs in numerical order. All dogs will be benched in the Catalogue order and owners' dogs of the same breed will be benched together without extra fee. No decorations, pictures, cards or other notices may be placed over the benches except the Official Prize Cards and exhibitor's name and address as per KC Regulations. No bench number shall be changed from one pen to another, and no dog shall be benched on any but its own, numbered pen. Under no circumstances may partitions between the dogs be removed.
26. The Committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of the dogs brought for exhibition but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and purchasers of dogs and all other persons, that the Committee will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss or detention of or damage to a dog or dogs, boxes, hampers, collars or

- any other property whatever, arising from accident, or any other cause whatever, nor from any act or omission of themselves, their officers, agents, servants or others, and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
27. No dog may be removed from its bench except for the purpose of being prepared for exhibition, judged, exercised or by order of the Veterinary Surgeon or Show Committee. After being prepared for exhibition the dog must be replaced on its bench. No dog shall be absent from its bench for the purpose of exercise for longer than 15 minutes. If a dog is not on its bench when required for judging, the Committee will not be responsible for its absence from the Show Ring.
 28. No animal other than a dog duly entered for the show will be allowed within the precincts of the Show during its continuance, except a registered guide dog for the blind.
 29. Conversation not allowed in the Judging Ring. Exhibitors showing dogs are not allowed to hold conversation with the judges during competition. No person other than the exhibitors (officials excepted) will be allowed in the Ring during the judging of classes or specials.
 30. Should any of the judges be prevented from fulfilling their engagements, the Executive Committee reserves to itself the right of appointing other judges to fulfil their duties. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be returned. Subject to the terms of the Kennel Club Limited Show Regulations B1 23(d).
 31. The Judges will be instructed and empowered to withhold the prize or prizes in any class if in their opinion the dog or dogs exhibited do not possess sufficient merit. Judges are not empowered to give prizes beyond those offered in the Schedule of Prizes.
 32. All Judges are requested to take the classes in each breed in the order in which they are entered in the Judging Book.
 33. Objections and Protests. All objections must be made in accordance with KC Regulation B1 26.
 34. The Committee will not be in any way responsible for any claim for injury or compensation occasioned by or arising out of the holding of the Show, or by reason of the act or default of any person in attendance or present thereat.
 35. In the case of emergency, as to which the Committee shall be the sole judge, the Committee may, at its discretion, alter the place of holding the Show, either before or after the entries are received. In the case of such alteration, no exhibitor shall be entitled to the return of any entry money which may have been paid by him/her before receiving notice of the same.
 36. Rules and Regulations, or definitions and instructions of the nature of Rules and Regulations printed for convenience in other parts of this Schedule, shall be deemed to be the Regulations of the Committee and shall have the same effect as if they formed part of these Regulations.
 37. Grooming products on sale at the Show may not meet the requirements of the Kennel Club Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition. In this connection exhibitors are reminded that the responsibility for ensuring that the dogs are correctly prepared for exhibition rests with them and the committee can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stand holders at this show.
 38. Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club Licensed Show within the Licensed venue and within the environs of that event, including car and caravan parks and approaches. Whilst special containers for use of exhibitors and handlers and, if possible, equipment to deal with fouling will be provided, this will not absolve those responsible for dogs being properly equipped. Special stewards will be on duty in an effort to ensure that the foregoing requirements are carried out.
 39. Committee the Sole Authority. The Committee shall be the sole authority for the interpretation of these Rules and of the Bye-Laws and Regulations made thereunder subject to the right of appeal to the Committee of the Kennel Club; and the decision of the Committee upon any question of interpretation or upon any matter affecting the Club or dogs or Dog Shows and not provided for by these Rules or by the Constitution and Bye-Laws or any Regulation, shall be final and binding. A person attending or entering a dog for any Show shall by such act be deemed to have agreed with the Committee to refer any such question or dispute to the Committee.
 40. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches.
 41. A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge (this shall not apply to a Judge appointed in an emergency); b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees.
 42. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.
 43. Children: The parent or guardian of any child causing any damage whatsoever on the showground will be liable to prosecution.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Wednesday, 26th September 2018**.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

1) Withdrawal

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 20.

2) Transfer

- (a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height, or in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- (b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class, to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- (c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- (d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the day of the Show

MAIDEN For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First Prize at Open or Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

NOVICE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open or Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

MID LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won five or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit or Open Classes confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

IMPORTED BREED REGISTER For breeds confined to the Imported Breeds Register and only when an Interim Breed Standard has been published by the Kennel Club. Such breeds may be exhibited in this class only, with the winning dog being eligible for Best in Group / Best Puppy in Group or Best in Show / Best Puppy in Show as relevant.

KENNEL CLUB BREEDERS' COMPETITION Each team will consist of a minimum of three and maximum of four dogs of one breed, all bred by the same breeder or breeding partnership. The breeder enters the class and then arranges which dogs are exhibited on the day of the show (from those dogs duly entered for exhibition in another class at this show). Please clearly state the name and affix of the registered breeder(s). Entries will not be taken on the day of the show. Teams will be awarded points/prize money in the KC Breeders' Competition as follows: Points 1st; 30; 2nd 15; 3rd 10; 4th 5. Prize Money 1st Non ABS Prize Fund £20; ABS Prize Fund £25. Please note that Assured Breeders will be credited with a higher prize value. These points will be recorded in the Kennel Club Breeders Competition record book through the year. The minimum qualification for the Crufts final will be 50 points, with a maximum of 40 finalists including the winning teams from the European and World Dog Shows' breeders competition. Our Dogs will collate the points and publish a leader board through the year. **Please Note: Dogs which take part in the Breeders' Competition, but are not entered in the show, are required to have a completed entry form. Owners of these dogs must attend the Secretary's office to complete the entry form.**

YKC MEMBERS' STAKES Only dogs of six (6) calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for entry into a YKC qualifying stakes class. Dogs must be on the Kennel Club Breed register to compete in a YKC stakes competition. The YKC method for Crufts qualification is a points based system as follows: 1st Place = 30 points; 2nd Place = 15 points; 3rd Place = 10 points. If a member and dog combination accumulate 30 points or more, they will qualify for Crufts. Points will be allocated for the Dog and Handler pairing. All points are reset to 0 on 1st February each year. All pedigree dogs are eligible to take part provided the dog is registered on the Kennel Club Breed Register. The dog must be registered; a. Solely or jointly in the member's name or b. In the name of a close member of the family (i.e a group of people related by blood or marriage) and under these circumstances the dog must be resident at the YKC member's address. No substitute handlers are permitted - the dog must be handled by the registered YKC member. Members are not permitted to allow another individual to show their dog at the qualifier on their behalf if they are not able to attend the class, unless agreed by the YKC Office prior to the show. Members must be aged 6 -24 years (members 6 years and up to, but not including 25th birthday). Please note that membership of the YKC terminates on a members 25th birthday. Therefore if a member is aged 25 years or over by the first day of Crufts they will be unable to compete in any YKC class. Please keep this in mind when entering qualifiers throughout the competing year. In order to enter any YKC competition, you must be a fully paid up member at the time of entry and competition. If you enter a Crufts qualifier and you have not previously paid your membership fee then any award will be forfeited. Therefore it is important to renew and maintain YKC membership as current if you wish to participate in YKC competitions. Before competing, please view a full list of the YKC competition rules at: www.ykc.org.uk/ and follow the compete tab.

YKC MEMBERS' HANDLING CLASSES Only dogs of six (6) calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for entry into an YKC qualifying class. Classes for handling are decided by the handler's age. The classes are divided into three age groups: 6-11 years (6 years and up to, but not including 12th birthday); 12-17 years (12 years and up to, but not including 18th birthday); 18-24 years (18 years and up to, but not including 25th birthday). Please enter the class age category you will be on the day of the qualifier. If you should move into the next age range after you have already qualified, the YKC will invite you into the correct age group at Crufts. The method for Crufts qualification is a points based system as follows: 1st Place = 30 points; 2nd Place = 15 points; 3rd Place = 10 points. Members will receive points per group (i.e. if they handle a Bloodhound, they will get points towards the Hound group). If a member gets 30 points in any one group, they will qualify to enter a dog from that group at Crufts 2019. If a member gains 30 or more points in multiple groups, they may only compete with one dog at Crufts, but they will have the option to choose from any of the groups they have 30 or more points in. All points are reset to 0 on 1st January each year. In order to enter any YKC competition, you must be a fully paid up member at the time of entry and competition. If you enter a Crufts qualifier and you have not previously paid your membership fee then any award will be forfeited. Before competing, please view a full list of the YKC competition rules at: www.ykc.org.uk/ and follow the compete tab.

PUPPY STAKES Open to all puppies of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR STAKES For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING STAKES For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

POST GRADUATE STAKES For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

VETERAN STAKES For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

CHAMPION STAKES For dogs, which have been confirmed, a Champion, show Champion or Field Trial Champion.

FIELD TRIAL STAKES For dogs which have won prizes, Diplomas of Merit or Certificates of Merit in actual competition at a Field Trial held under Kennel Club or Irish Kennel Club Field Trial Regulations.

BRACE STAKES For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team.

OPEN STAKES For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

MEMBERS' OPEN STAKES For Any Variety Dog or Bitch, exhibited and handled by a MEMBER OF G.B.A.S. If a dog is owned by a partnership, both must be members.

GOOD CITIZEN DOG SCHEME CLASS For dogs that have achieved their GCDS Bronze Award Certificate or above.

ADVISORY NOTICE

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not For Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

ENTRY FORMS

It would be of the greatest assistance if, in completing their entry forms, exhibitors would bear the following in mind:

1. Please write in **BLOCK CAPITALS**.
2. Please DO NOT enter dogs belonging to different owners on the same entry form.
3. Please remember that, if you own one dog yourself and another in partnership with someone else, you and the partnership rank as different owners and the dogs should NOT be entered on the same form.
4. Please give the date of birth correctly, especially the year. It often means expensive tele-messages or telephone calls and results in a great deal of extra work.
5. Please sign the Declaration and note the additional sentence at the end regarding liability.
6. Please state breed(s) entered in all correspondence.
7. Please state whether or not you are applying for membership of the Association.
8. Please make your cheque/Bank Draft/M.O./P.O. payable to the **Gundog Breeds Association of Scotland**.
9. Please post your entries early. Do not wait until the closing date (3rd October 2018). USE FIRST CLASS MAIL
