BASIC RULES

ALL EXHIBITORS WILL BE REQUIRED TO FOLLOW IF ATTENDING THE INTERNATIONAL POODLE CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW

The Committee would request that you help us by following these simple rules in order that we hold a safe show.

PLEASE NOTE: If you are not prepared to follow these basic rules, do not bother to attend. If you are caught breaking any of these rules during the show you will be asked to leave.

IPC's COVID-19 Risk Assessment will be on display in various places around the show. You are all advised to read it and pay strict attention to it.

ON THE DAY OF THE SHOW

1. If you, anyone in your household or any member of your family or friends (that you are in close contact with) has Covid-19 related symptoms or has tested positive for Covid-19 they must not attend the event and should self isolate in line with Government advice. Don't be selfish stay at home.
2. Any Committee Members, Judges or Exhibitors living, at the date of the show, in an area which is under lockdown, do not attend the show. If you attempt to attend you will be sent away. The secretary will keep an eye on lockdown areas during the preceding weeks.
3. Inside, you will be expect to wear a face covering at all times outside of your own grooming area. Only an exemption letter from your doctor will be accepted as grounds for not wearing one.
4. Due to social distancing, **no spectators** will be allowed at the show, this includes friends and family. The only exceptions are; if you have to bring your children due to no one else being available to look after them, or if the dog is in partnership and they are within your social bubble. If you have entered more than 2 dogs a helper will be accepted. The helper must sign in at the door on arrival as their details will not be in the catalogue.
5. Please do not mix any closer than the 1 metre minimum distancing rules, with people outside your social bubble (such as going over to see a friend(s) who you haven't seen since Crufts). If you are warned by a member of the Committee but persist, you will be asked to leave the show.
6. **NO** grooming of other exhibitors dogs unless they are within you own social bubble. If you are warned by a member of the Committee but persist you will be asked to leave the show.
7. The social distancing rules apply at **all times** throughout the day along with a good hygiene practice (handwashing etc.).
8. There will be a strict one-way system in place for entrance to and exit from the show. If you go to the foyer toilets, or outside to exercise or smoke you will have to go out of the exit and come back in the entrance to go back to your tables.
9. The judging will be split. Standards will be first into the ring in the morning and will be permitted entrance to the show from 8.15 am (judging starts promptly at 9.30 am). Unless you are a class winner, we advise you pack up and leave as soon as possible. **You will NOT be able to spectate around the ring at any time.** Once Standard judging is completed, Standard Poodle exhibitors will have half an hour to exit the building (other than the BOB, BPIB and BVIB, owners and helpers of said award winners).
10. All Miniature and Toy Exhibitors will be allowed entry to the show from 12.15 pm and **not** before. Judging starts promptly at 1.30 pm and again all Miniature and Toy Exhibitors will be subject to the same rules above. We would ask Miniature and Toy exhibitors to also vacate the building after their judging is complete.
11. The only exception to these rules will be for paid up members attending the AGM at 4.00 pm. They must sign in separately for the AGM and will be required to place all their equipment into their cars prior to the AGM. Only the member and their dog(s) should be in the building for the AGM.

FINALLY

ALL EXHIBITORS WILL BE EXPECTED TO CLEAR UP AFTER THEMSELVES AND TAKE IT HOME WITH THEM (THIS INCLUDES ANY RUBBISH AND DOG HAIR) AS IT CLASSIFIED AS CONTAMINATED BIO HAZARD WASTE. A WASTE BAG WITH YOUR NAME ON IT WILL BE SUPPLIED IN EACH ENVELOPE CONTAINING YOUR CATALOGUE AND / OR RING NUMBER. IF ANYONE IS CAUGHT NOT DOING THIS THEY WILL BE NAMED AND SHAMED ON SOCIAL MEDIA.

• DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES •

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Saturday, 12th September 2020.**

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) *Withdrawal*

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F.(1).19.

(2) *Transfer*

a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars, or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL OPEN AOC THAN BLACK OR WHITE For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show, but restricted to colour as listed in the classification.

SPECIAL OPEN AOC THAN BLACK For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show, but restricted to colour as listed in the classification.

ADVISORY NOTICE

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries.

Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

• RULES and REGULATIONS •

1. The Show will open at 8.15 am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence not before 9.30 am.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. Fees: Breeds **with** CCs on offer: Members £16.00 first entry per dog, £2.00 each subsequent entry with same dog; Non-Members £19.00 First entry per dog, £2.00 each subsequent entry with the same dog. Breeds **without** CCs on offer: Members £6.00 first entry per dog, £2.00 each subsequent entry with the same dog; Non-Members £9.00 First entry per dog, £2.00 each subsequent entry with the same dog. Not for Competition: £5.00 per dog. Catalogues: £3.00 pre-paid with entry only (none on the day). Subscriptions per annum: Single £3.00, Joint £5.00.
6. There is no prize money on offer at this show.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **Best Puppy in Show:** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed, (Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy). A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show respectively.
11. **Best in Show:** The dog declared Best in Show must be selected from those dogs which have been declared Best of Breed (or Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified). Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Best of Breed(s) and the dog/bitch declared by the breed judge to be Reserve Best of Breed to the dog declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days:** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**

17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
18. Not for competition entries not accepted.
19. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
20. If in the opinion of the Show Secretary, Show Manager or Judge any dog is considered not in a fit state for exhibition owing to a disease, savage disposition, or any other cause, the dog may be excluded or removed from the show the dog must not be brought into the Show at any time under any circumstances.
21. Should any judge be prevented from fulfilling their engagement, the Committee reserves to themselves the right of appointing other judges to fulfil their duties. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be refunded.
22. The Committee will do its utmost to ensure the safety of the dogs brought for exhibition but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and all other persons at the Show that the Committee will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any dogs or property, or personal injury whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever.
23. Any owner, competitor or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.
24. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at a Kennel Club licensed event must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).
25. A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been: a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled Judge, this shall not apply to a Judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees.
26. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.
27. The Committee of the show can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stand holders at the show, and remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

EXHIBITORS ARE REMINDED THAT ALL CAGES/CRATES MUST HAVE THE DOG'S RING NUMBER AND/OR OWNERS NAME CLEARLY DISPLAYED THROUGHOUT THE DURATION OF THE SHOW.
