ABOUT YOUR JUDGES

Dogs: Marita Bott (Bardonhill)

Born in Leicestershire to a family with no connection whatever with livestock, so no idea where my love of animals comes from, but it started early with a collection of Goldfish, Guinea pigs, and Rabbits. No dogs until I was 14, but I did walk as many of the neighbours' dogs as I could! My first dog was a Yorkshire Terrier from a commercial kennel. He was imported from Southern Ireland in a crate, undershot, drop eared and weighed 3 times more than a Yorkie should. He was difficult to get registered with the KC - so you could say I learned about buying a dog the hard way!

After marrying, I wanted a dog to show, undecided between a Dalmatian or an Irish Setter. The Setter won.

My first Irish Setter was Fondador Fleur on Bardonhill born 1970 and mainly Brackenfield breeding. The Affix, Bardonhill, was registered in 1973 and named after the area where I lived.

Most of my current dogs descend from Moyna April at Bardonhill purchased from Barbara Birch in 1978. From her first litter to Sh Ch Scarletti Cockney Rebel, came Sh Ch Bardonhill Supergrass, who, through his daughter Barleydale Ooh la la Its Bardonhill, produced Sh Ch Bardonhill Splashdown JW, Ir Sh Ch Bardonhill Overboard, also Sh Ch Bardonhill Seabreeze Over Thendara and Bardonhill Bikini - two of three Bardonhill foundation bitches of Thendara.

Moyna April's litter to Sh Ch Kerryfair Night Fever produced Sh Ch Bardonhill Kiss-A-gram (dam of Sh Ch Bardonhill Team Spirit at Wynjill and also Bardonhill Co-Starring Anlory, foundation bitch of Anlory), Then came Sh Ch Bardonhill Ginger-Whinger JW, Sh Ch Bardonhill Singing Skies Over Anlory JW, Sh Ch Bardonhill Floating Moon into Glenlaine JW, and the two most recent girls: Sh Ch Bardonhill Please Don't Tease Quensha JW and Sh Ch Bardonhill Guilty Pleasure. To date I have bred ten UK Show Champions.

I have also owned two more show Champions bred by other Kennels, Sh Ch Shenanagin Some Might Say it's Bardonhill JW and Sh Ch Gwendariff D'Ya Know My Name By Bardonhill JW.

I have twice had the honour of owning an Irish Setter awarded Best of Breed at Crufts, with Sh Ch Bardonhill Kiss-A-Gram in 1990 and then with Sh Ch Shenanagin Some Might Say it's Bardonhill JW in 2002.

I have awarded CCs in Irish Setters since 1980 and have judged in Europe.

With my partner, Ian Newsham, we run the www.bardonhill.com website, for Irish Setters. Hard work and time consuming but we feel it makes a significant contribution to the breed. Over the years I have been involved as a breed Club Secretary, general canine Club Secretary and served on several committees.

I worked for British Gas in the Engineering Systems Computer section involved with training and working on a digital mapping of gas mains.

We now live in the Lincolnshire Wolds where we also keep two Smooth Collies, Rare breed Thrianta rabbits, chickens, numerous rescue cats and cockatiels.

I also collect pottery, china and paintings and enjoy going to the theatre.

Bitches: Rita Pike (Scarletti)

I owned my first Irish Setter over fifty years ago. Unfortunately she had cancer and I lost her at 14 months old. Heartbroken, I contacted May Davis (Castleoak) and was so lucky to get Margretwoods Conductess from the fantastic litter bred by Barry and Mary Neave from Bridget of Castleoak by Sh Ch Scotswood Barabbas.

Most of my working life was spent in London as a Secretary/PA and I enjoyed everything about the great city and still do. Travel has always been my thing and I have a special love of Italy.

I first judged the breed in the late 70's at Open show level, gave my first CCs in 1984 and have

enjoyed judging in many far away places as well as the UK and at Crufts in 2001.

Working with the ISBC Committee the organizing of shows was a challenge at times, I also served on several Open Show Committees and helped with the rescue over the years.

I have very fond memories of the people who helped and inspired me. Things were different in the 70s/80s, just breeding when you wanted a new puppy to show. June Coates and Janice Roberts were my heroes, I just loved the type of Setters they produced. The great Troilus and Primrose are behind most of the successful exhibits today, although I doubt many are aware of it. I do believe that I was lucky to have been amongst such true believers in the breed.

Margretwoods Conductress was my first show girl. She owned my heart. She won a Reserve CC under the late John Harper, a big win, as I was showing with the big guns.

Scarlett was mated to Sh Ch Cornevon Stargem (Sh Ch Twoacres Troilus x Sh Ch Cornevon Primrose) producing Sh Ch Scarletti Cockney Rebel and Sh Ch Scarletti Hot Chocolate. The rest, as they say, is history.

Scarletti dogs and bitches have produced many Champions, CC winners, Reserve CC winners and Junior Warrant winners.

I feel honoured to judge at the forthcoming ISAE Championship Show, a fitting end to my long association with Irish Setters. A proud moment, as when completing this I will have judged all the Club Championship Shows, another personal goal for me.

I have had to say goodbye to some great friends and miss them terribly but still have some lovely special people today, my passion for this lovely breed will never die. It's been a good run.

Stakes Classes: Mr Gideon Hoeksema (Blazing Bronze) [Holland]

First of all I would like to thank you for the invitation to judge at the ISAE.

I feel honoured and humbled to stand besides such well known and respected judges that have been so influential to our beloved breed in the past decades and I feel privileged to judge the Memorial Stakes and would like to thank you in advance for your entries.

Having established a sure foothold in the dog world from my early teenage years, it took a while to be able to breed. My partner and I lived in the centre of Amsterdam for quite a few years and starting a kennel of red heads wasn't really an option when you must climb four flights of stairs every day.

However, that didn't stop us buying our first Irish, with her our love affair with the breed began.... showing, grooming and finding our way in the breed took up most of our spare time. My work as a Vet's Assistant and later running my own grooming salon meant that I came across many different breeds, yet none of them as captivating as Irish Setters.

We decided to get an affix, "Blazing Bronze" reflecting the luscious gleaming coat of an Irish as well as their often boisterous nature. My dream to be able to breed was realised when we bought the property we live in now almost ten years ago. A houseboat with a bit of land has proved ideal.

Our foundation was mostly Dutch and English lines, with a particular influence from Wickenberry and Withersdale. Over the years we've added several Swedish dogs to our lines. We also own English setters which we find make for a match made in heaven with our Irish Setters.

We currently own 8 dogs, most of them Champions, apart from youngsters who are too young to hold their titles, some of them have Benelux winner titles or world titles.

We are proud to have exported a few very successful dogs to the UK, Ireland, Estonia and Sweden with "Blazing Bronze Disco Inferno" claiming the joint number 1 position of ISF in Sweden 2017.

I am really looking forward to this event and I hope I will get to see and enjoy many of your lovely Setters.

RULES & REGULATIONS

(This is a Championship Show confined to Irish Setters (Red) and open to all exhibitors)

No other breed of dog will be allowed within the precincts of the show except those permitted by Regulation F(1) 3.55/11

1. The Show will open at 8.30 am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that dogs are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 9.30 am.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. Entry Fees: Members £18.00 first entry per dog; £2.00 each subsequent entry with the same dog; Non Members £22.00 first entry per dog; £3.00 each subsequent entry with the same dog. Not For Competition: Members £9.00/Non Members £12.00. Catalogues: £3.00 pre-paid with entries (limited number available on the day at £4.00). Membership: UK – Single £11.00; Joint £12.00; Overseas – Single/Joint £15.00.
6. There is no prize money on offer at this Show.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.

10. **Best Puppy in Show**

Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.

11. **Best in Show**

Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.

12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.

13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.

14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

15. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

16. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.

- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**

17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
19. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
20. All dogs must be brought with a suitable chain and a collar properly fastened to the dog.
21. All exhibits must be accompanied. The Committee cannot undertake to accept or despatch unaccompanied dogs.
22. Should any of the judges be prevented from fulfilling their engagement, the Committee reserve the right to appoint a substitute. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entrance fee can be refunded.
23. Each Judge will be instructed and empowered to withhold any prize in any class, if of the opinion that the dog does not possess sufficient merit. Judges are not empowered to give prizes beyond those offered in the Schedule. A Judges decision shall be final except in a case of fraud, or misrepresentation or where a mistake has been made bona fide by the Judge.
24. An announcement prior to closing of entries in 'Our Dogs' of any alterations or additions made by the Committee to the Schedule or to these Regulations, shall be deemed sufficient notice thereof.
25. Parents will be held responsible for the actions and any damage caused by their children within the environs of the show.
26. The Owner, Exhibitor, Handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club Licensed events, must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches.
27. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Anyone failing to clear up will be reported to the Committee who may enforce the right to refuse entries from that exhibitor for future shows.
28. The Committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of all dogs entered for exhibition and for any property entrusted to them, but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and other persons that the Committee will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss, or detention of or damage to any dog or person from any cause whatsoever, nor for any act or omission of themselves, their officers, Servants, agents or others, and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
29. The Officers & Committee of the Irish Setter Association, England cannot accept responsibility for any products advertised or sold by stall holders and/or trade stands at this Show. Exhibitors

are reminded that products on sale for the preparation and grooming of dogs may not meet the requirements of the Regulation for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition F(B).

30. A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been: a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled Judge, this shall not apply to a Judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees.
31. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.
32. The Association reserves to itself the right to refuse entries and all dishonoured cheques will be charged at £10 for subsequent presentations.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(The word "dog" includes both sexes)

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Saturday, 25th August 2018**. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) *Withdrawal*

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 20.

(2) *Transfer*

- a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer It to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

MAIDEN For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First Prize at an Open or Championship show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

NOVICE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

UNDERGRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 3 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy Classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 4 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

MINOR LIMIT For dogs which have not won two Challenge Certificates or three or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

MID LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/ CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won five or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit or Open Classes confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/ CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

FIELD TRIAL For dogs which have won prizes, Diplomas of Merit or Certificates of Merit in actual competition at a Field Trial held under Kennel Club or Irish Kennel Club Field Trial Regulations.

BRACE For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team.

SPECIAL BEGINNERS For dogs owned and handled by exhibitor neither Dog or exhibitor to have won a CC in the Breed. **Both dog and exhibitor to qualify.**

SPECIAL FIELD TRIAL For Dogs which have been entered and have run in any licensed Field Trial held under Kennel Club or Irish Kennel Club Field Trial Rules and Regulations.

SPECIAL PROGENY For a dog or bitch, accompanied by at least three and not more than six of its registered progeny. The dog or bitch not necessarily entered in another class however, all progeny having been entered and exhibited in another class. The dog or bitch and the progeny need not be registered in the same ownership. **See proviso to Regulation 12.**

THE CHRISTINE HERON MEMORIAL JUNIOR STAKES For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

THE GEOFF COUPE MEMORIAL POST GRADUATE STAKES For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

THE PAT RHODES MEMORIAL OPEN STAKES For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

ADVISORY NOTICE

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.
