• YOUR JUDGES •

Dogs: Mr Peter Rademacher (Rodsden) [USA]

In 1945, my father Perrin G. Rademacher got his first Rottweiler. With his sister Joan R. Klem, they created the kennel Rodsdens Rottweilers. So I have had the pleasure of being around Rottweilers, literally all my life.

As a junior I participated in both American Obedience and Conformation. Since that time I have owned and bred many Conformation Champions. The great majority of which also had some sort of working title. I have been on the other end of the lead of dogs that have had tracking titles, obedience titles and Schutzhund titles. All of which I trained myself. I also have been fortunate enough to be on the other end of a dog, that took Best in Specialty Show.

My judging career began almost 20 years ago in 2000 (Yikes). I have judged some of the largest specialities in the United States. These include The Medallion Rottweiler Club and The American Rottweiler Club, some more than once. I have judged overseas in Jamaica, New Zealand and even previously in the UK. I had the pleasure of judging for the Midlands Rottweiler Club a few years back. Now I look forward to meeting all of you and of course your dogs. The opportunity to judge for The LASER Club is truly a special privilege, so let's have some fun, with a great show.

Bitches: Mrs June Wall (Everready) [ROI]

I have owned and bred Rottweilers with my husband under the "Everready" prefix since 1990. We have campaigned 10 Champion Rottweilers to their titles. I am the secretary of the Rottweiler Club of Ireland, a position I have held for over 20 years. I have given a seminar on the breed for the Irish Kennel Club. I am currently on the Board of Directors of the Irish Kennel Club and prior to that I was on the judges committee. Rottweilers are my passion and I always enjoy judging this wonderful breed around the world.

Best in Show: Mrs Maggi Bryant (Panelma)

I fell in love with my first Rottweiler in 1967/8 but did not own one until 1974, when Panelma was born with my then husband Pat Bryant, our first Rottweiler came from Rita Parratt and Tony Shaw, he was Ritonshay Donald Duck who was a big dog with a big heart.

Next came Javictreva Team Mascot who was also the first Panelma Champion. She produced in her first litter Panelma The Special Lady who was mated to Ch Chesara Dark Charles and this litter produced:- Panelma The Pirate JW (who I believe is the breeds youngest JW old style who gained his points by nine and a half months), Ch Panelma The Highwayman and Ch Panelma The Adventurer.

Other Panelma Champions have been Ch Blue The Boy Wonder and Ch Kenstaff Klingel at Panelma 3 CCs & 11 RCCs (so don't ever give up) and Panelma The Starlet 1 CC, plus 4 overseas Champions.

In 1991, I started again with Panelma in my name with Debashar Enigma with Panelma 4 RCCs and have since then slowly with selective breeding re built my line, the accumulation of this is Panelma Geti Gyrima The Aviator, ex Panelma Vudumagic Top Rottweiler Puppy 2017.

I commenced judging in 1978 and I gave my first set of tickets at Richmond in 1985, I have given CCs at Crufts 95 (Dogs) and Crufts 96 (bitches).

In 1993 I judged dogs at Leeds and gave the CC to Ch Svedala The Scandinavian and was delighted to have seen him win the Working Group under go onto Best in Show under the late great Terry Thorn. This was only the second time we as a breed had received this accolade.

The first time was with Ch Rudi Anton Bali and I was proud to be involved with that as well.

I was on the LASER Committee for 12 years, and took over as Chairman when it was still a branch of The BRA, and with a great committee and a lot of hard work we eventually became a club in our own right, thankfully most of that hard working committee stayed true and eventually in 1990 we were allocated our first set of tickets for 1993.

I retired from LASER in early 1992 and took it as a great honour to be asked to judge dogs at their first Championship Show in 1993. So I feel the wheel has gone full circle and I am hugely honoured to judge BIS 2018.

Special Award Classes: Jane Tibbs (Zeleski)

This affix was originally Zelaski many years ago when I showed and bred Rottweilers. In error in 2014 the affix lapsed and when I asked to renew this with the KC they declined my request because another affix had been granted to a person in another breed that was similar. The way round this was to change the A to an E!

The affix was originally my sisters and the name was picked from watching a film called Das Boot about a war submarine. It was a subtitled film and at the end in the credits, the name Zelaski was spotted and decided upon. An affix was needed at the time as my sister and I had decided to mate our two Rottweilers, Fernwood Firestorm and Fernwood Galaxy – this litter produced Champion Zelaski Huckleberry Fin of Casbrion who was awarded 4 CCs and a BOB at Crufts in 1998 – no mean feat back in the late 90s when entry numbers were extremely high. It wasn't unusual then to have in the region of 30 dogs in just one class and 250 plus at a Championship Show!

I have shown Rottweilers periodically from 1990 until 2014 moving over to Dogue de Bordeaux in the last 7 years. I fell in love with the Rottweiler when my mother's hairdresser introduced me to her rather large, but very loving Rottie who charged up the hallway pinning me against the wall before licking my face.

Over the years there have been several CCs awarded to our dogs and 11 that have gained their Stud Book number. In 1999 my husband and I produced a litter from which 6 were exhibited in the show ring. Between them they were awarded 3 CCs and 4 RCCs with all 6 gaining their Stud Book numbers.

I am pleased to judge Rottweilers and Dogue de Bordeaux as my main breeds and I recently started judging Bullmastiff, Boxer and Dobermann.

I first judged Rottweilers in 1996 but took a break from judging between 2001 and 2009. When I then decided to start judging again I realised I hadn't kept any of my judging confirmations or any information and had to re-start the judging process from the beginning. I am pleased to say that I carried on and am now on the B List with the Rottweiler Breed Council and judged my first Breed Club Show in January.

In 2005 I met a Dogue de Bordeaux owned by friends who also had Rottweilers. I instantly loved the breed and when the time was right in 2007 my first Dogue de Bordeaux Lola arrived and my Rotties loved her. My home is now filled with these 2 fabulous breeds.

With the commencement of CCs for Dogue de Bordeaux at Crufts 2016 and just 7 sets of CC for the year, we were delighted for one of our males to be awarded the RDCC at Crufts by Jeff Horswell beaten by a lovely Bordeaux from Italy. Our male has since become an International Champion and been awarded a further 2 RCC and awarded numerous BOB at non CC Championship Shows with a Working Group 4 in the UK, a placing that is very rare for this breed. He also gained his ShCM from just 11 shows.

I have judged Dogue de Bordeaux since 2010 and have recently moved to the A3 judging list having judged at Richmond Championship Show in 2016 and Leeds Championship Show in July 2017.

I am delighted to have been asked to judge the Specials Classes and look forward to judging some quality exhibits.

RULES and REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 8.30 am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time after the opening of the show but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that dogs are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence with Dogs at 9.30 am; Bitches NOT before 11.00 am.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. **Entry Fees: Members:** First Entry per dog £22.00; each subsequent entry with same dog £3.50. **Non-Members:** First entry per dog £25.00; each subsequent entry with same dog £4.00. **Veteran Classes:** Free entry. **Special Award Classes:** £3.50 per entry. **Not for Competition:** £3.50 per dog. **Membership:** Single or Joint: £12.00 per annum (£10.00 if paid by Direct Debit). **Catalogues:** £3.50 pre-paid with entries, (*limited number on the day at £4.00*). **Welfare Donation:** £1.00 (*split 50/50 Rottweiler Welfare/Rottweilers in Need*).
6. Prize Money is offer as follows: BIS £50.00; RBIS £30.00; BPIS £20.00; BVIS £20.00; Special Award Classes: £10.00 each class winner.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **Best Puppy in Show** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Best in Show.
11. **Best in Show** Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11..
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**
17. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
18. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
19. This Show will be held under Kennel Club Rules and Show Regulations. Every exhibitor making an entry at this Show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by these Rules and Regulations and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
20. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.
21. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This Regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).
22. Outside Attraction/Double Handling will NOT be tolerated at this show.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Friday, 29th June 2018**.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- (1) *Withdrawal*
The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 20.
- (2) *Transfer*
 - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

NOVICE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

CHAMPION For dogs that have been confirmed a Champion/Show Champion under Kennel Club Regulations or any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNE MARTIN SPECIAL AWARD PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

MARGERETTE DAVIDS SPECIAL AWARD YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

LASER ABSENT FRIENDS SPECIAL OPEN For all Rottweilers for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

ADVISORY NOTICE

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

DOUBLE HANDLING

Outside Attraction/Double Handling will NOT be tolerated at this show. The Kennel Club is adopting a strict approach to double handling and all exhibitors are reminded of the provisions of the Regulations in respect of this.

Please note that under Kennel Club Regulations the Show Management may order that Judging be suspended and/or a class may be abandoned. The abandonment of a class is clearly an outcome that benefits no-one, but it is nonetheless a necessary final step to ensure the practice of double handling is prevented and to allow all exhibitors to compete in a fair environment.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS/DOG OWNERS

The KC General Committee has given detailed consideration to the problems arising when dogs are left in vehicles at shows.

It is considered that the act of causing suffering to a dog as a result of it being left in a vehicle by an exhibitor or the owner of a registered dog on a hot day could be considered discreditable or prejudicial to the interests of the canine world and could form the basis of a case under Kennel Club Rule A11.

Remedial action will be taken in the event of dogs left in vehicles being found in a distressed condition.

TRADE STANDS: The Committee can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by standholders at the Show and wish to remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

EXERCISE AREA: An Exercise Area will be provided. Exhibitors/Handlers are required to clear up any fouling by the dog(s) in their charge.

DISCLAIMER: L.A.S.E.R. will not be responsible for any claim for injury or compensation occasioned by or arising out of the holding of the Show or by reason of the act or default of any person in attendance thereat.

WELFARE OF DOGS

An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put their dogs health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Right to refuse entries: Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulations to refuse any entry.
