Dogs: Mrs Aleks Greenhalgh (Leksmoor)

I first fell for our elegant breed in 1984 and bought a bitch puppy from Jillian Spencer. Zofie was initially bought as a pet, but you always know someone who shows and decides that this hobby would be ideal for you. Zofie did not really like showing, unless there was liver involved, so I started to show her friend an Ambersand bitch at opens shows, and I was smitten.

In 1990 I bought my first Cumbersett bitch from Sonia Clarke: Cumbersett Tethera of Leksmoor, and Portia took me to the heights of Crufts. Another Cumbersett (C. Dacres Delight at L.) came into the household and Gilly became the foundation bitch to the stock Gary and I showed until 2012. The highlight of our showing career was when our Amber, Leksmoor Bellance won a CC in 2006, so never having the honour to make up a show champion I appreciate and admire the ones that have.

We bought in a Deerhound in 2012 as having back problems we wanted something bigger, and he fits in nicely with the remaining setters.

Gary and I are both active members of the Northern English Setter Society and I also run the Club's shop.

I have judged our breed for the past 15 years and I am honoured to have been asked by the Midland English Setter Society to judge dogs at this show and look forward to the day.

Bitches: Mr Keith A.W. Young (Pyngold)

Keith first became involved in showing dogs in the 1970s when the family bought a Golden Retriever having previously had an Irish Setter. Subsequently he and his wife, June, registered their affix Pyngold.

Keith began judging Golden Retrieves at open shows in 1983 and was approved to award Challenge Certificates in 1990. He awarded Challenge Certificates in English Setters for the first time at the Gundog Society of Wales show in 2004. This appointment will be the sixth time he has awarded CCs in the breed.

Keith is currently approved by the Kennel Club to award Challenge Certificates in 13 breeds within the Gundog Group.

Keith says that he is greatly looking forward to judging at MESS, particularly as it is a society that, together with his wife, he has always enjoyed attending. Indeed they have both been regular visitors at both the Open and Championship shows over a great number of years.

Finally Keith wishes to thank the society for the kind invitation to judge at their breed show.

Referee: Mrs Maureen Withey (Scratchwood)

My first English came in to my life in 1973 as a pet, but I quickly got the 'show bug'. Then, in 1975 two more Setters joined our family (one a rescue with papers) both became Show Champions. Others we bred and owned were campaigned by us, one becoming a show champion and others gaining many top awards under the affix Scratchwood. I am now in partnership with Fiona Mitchell (Sunsprake); we currently own Sh Ch Sunsprake Raging Storm Over Scratchwood, and have gained CCs, Res CCs, Best Puppy etc with current and other Setters owned and shown by us.

In the late 1970s, Margaret Green and I decided to do a survey to see if there was any interest in forming an English Setter Society in the Midlands, of course there was, and so MESS was founded. I served for many years as a committee member, and eventually as Treasurer. I am now proud to be President and a life member of a society I call 'my baby'.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Monday**, 1st January 2018.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- (1) Withdrawal
 - The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.
- (2) Transfer
 - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class or Puppy class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age or eighteen calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class or the Junior class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy or Junior class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weig-ht or height.
 - c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four months of age on the first day of the Show.

MAIDEN For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First Prize at an Open or Championship Show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

NOVICE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

TYRO For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

UNDERGRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 3 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy Classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 4 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

MID LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the KC, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 5 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where CCs were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL BEGINNERS For owner, handler or exhibit not having won a Challenge Certificate in the breed.

DON CHRISTIE MEMORIAL JUNIOR STAKES For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

DON CHRISTIE MEMORIAL OPEN STAKES For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

CHAIRMAN'S CHAMPION AWARD For dogs which have been confirmed a Champion, show Champion or Field Trial Champion.

ADVISORY NOTICE

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Not for Competition entries will only be accepted for English Setters.

RULES and REGULATIONS

- 1. The Show will open at 9.00 am.
- Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging will commence at 9.45 am for bitches and 10.15 am for dogs.
- 4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
- 6. Entry Fees: Members: £14.00 first entry per dog, £3.00 each subsequent entry with same dog; Non-Members: £15.50 first entry per dog, £3.00 each subsequent entry with same dog; Stakes Classes: £3.00 per Class. Not for Competition (English Setters only): £1.00 per dog. Catalogues: £3.50 in advance; limited number at Show. £3.50 at the Show. Advertisements: £10.00 full page. Membership: £6.00 Single; £8.50 Joint; £10.00 Overseas.
- 7. Prize Money: Special Award Classes 1st £10.00; 2nd £5.00; 3rd £4.00; Reserve £3.00; VHC £2.00
- 8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 11. **Best Puppy in Show** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.
 - Withdrawal from Other Competition: Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate, in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
 - *Proviso:* For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
- 12. **Best in Show** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which had competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.
 - Withdrawal from Other Competition: Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
 - *Proviso:* For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
- 13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 14. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 15. It is not acceptable to handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. Exhibitors should note that such practices could constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 17. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

- 18. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - · If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths
 of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

- 19. Not for Competition (English Setters only) entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- 20. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.
- 21. The show will be held under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Every exhibitor having entered will be declared to have agreed to abide by the aforesaid Rules and Regulations.
- 22. All postal entries must be made by Monday, 8th January 2018 (Postmark). On-line entries can be made until midnight on Monday, 15th January 2018.
- 23. Should a Judge be prevented from fulfilling his/her engagement, the Committee reserves to itself the right to appoint a substitute.
- 24. No animal other than a dog duly entered at the Show will be allowed within the precincts of the Show except by permission of the Committee.
- 25. Passes will not be sent out. Acknowledgment of entries will be posted on receipt of a stamped, addressed envelope.
- 26. The Committee is empowered to exclude or remove any dog which is not in a fit state for exhibition either from disease, vice or any other cause.
- 27. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Any failing to clear up will be reported to the Committee who may enforce the right to refuse entries from that exhibitor for future Shows.
- 28. The Committee of Midland English Setter Society can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stand holders at the Show and wish to remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 29. Should any question arise not provided for in these Rules, the Committee decision shall be final, subject to appeal at the Kennel Club.
- 30. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This Regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).
- 31. A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been: a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled Judge, this shall not apply to a Judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees.
- 32. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.


