## **A PROFILE OF OUR CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW JUDGE**

### **MR MARTIN PHILLIPS (JAEVA)**

I have been breeding and showing dogs since I was 14. I started showing my father's Staffordshire Bull Terriers and made up my first Champion at 16. I handled the first SBT to win a Best in Show at a General Championship Show when I was 17 and still hold that record.

I soon fell in love with the Norfolk and Norwich Terriers which became my principal breeds. I have had multiple Best in Shows with the breeds, and to date have bred or owned over 100 UK Champions which includes Norfolk, Norwich, Flat Coated Retriever, Soft Coated Wheaten Terrier, St. Bernard and a Sealyham.

I award Challenge Certificates in all Terrier breeds, as well as CCs in Flat Coats and St. Bernards and have judged many Groups in the UK including the Terrier Group at Crufts in 2015. I have judged Worldwide.

Airedales have always held a place close to my heart, and I did own one many years ago, which did produce a litter for me.

## **A PROFILE OF OUR SPECIAL AWARDS CLASSES JUDGE**

### **MR SIMON ACTON (JANTARADON)**

My first association with the breed was from a very early age; my father had bought his first Airedale Terrier, Tintara Desperado (Guy) in 1979. So the Airedale came first. When my father left home, Guy remained with my Grandparents. Throughout my childhood I have very fond memories of growing up around Guy. I fondly remember riding on his back as a toddler, remembering how he used to guard babies' prams and how on occasions we would stop off at the shop on a walk at the weekend to buy Guy a meat and potato pie and a cream cake!

In 2002, we decided that we wanted to get another dog and after discussion, the Airedale came top of the list. We bought Janber Over The Hill of Jantaradon, primarily as a pet, and after deciding to have a go at trimming ourselves we entered a pet show and caught the showing bug. Harvey was a baptism of fire and certainly a handful in the ring. As we became more involved in showing we bought Saredon Aim For The Stars of Jantaradon from the late Mrs Judith Averis to show and become our brood bitch. Since then, over the last 16 years we have bred a number of litters and exhibited different Airedales including: Jantaradon Starchaser, Jantaradon He's The Wizard and Jantaradon Superfly Sister.

In my quest to learn more about the breed, I passed all of the KC and breed specific seminars. This has been my route into judging. I have also served on the committee of the NEATC for a number of years and hold the position of Chairman.

It will be a privilege to assess your dogs.

## **THE NATIONAL AIREDALE TERRIER ASSOCIATION SPECIAL AWARD CLASSES**

With the kind permission of the Kennel Club, NATA are pleased to schedule Special Award Classes at this Show. Special Award Classes are a form of "mock class" which can be scheduled at a show for the purpose of allowing a B or C List Judge the opportunity to gain more hands on experience of the breed and to include such experience on their Judging CV. It is hoped that by including these classes at our Championship Show, the invited Judge will receive the valued support of our exhibitors.

Here are a few points to note:

- The beaten dog rule does **not** apply to the Special Award Classes.
- You are free to continue in all competition in the Championship Show, regardless of the outcome of these classes.
- Any dog entered into the main show is eligible for entry into the Special Award Classes.
- A "Best of Special Award Classes" is not permitted.
- As with all classes in the main show, rosettes and prize cards are available for 1st to VHC. Further prizes will be available for each Special Award Class winner.
- Entry fee to each Special Award Class is just £1.00 which will be donated to the Airedale Terrier Health Fund.

## RULES & REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 10.00 am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that dogs are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 11.00 am.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. Entry Fees: **Members** £12.00 first entry per dog; Each subsequent entry with the same dog: £1.50. **Non-Members** £14.50 first entry per dog; Each subsequent entry with the same dog: £2.00. Special Award Classes: £1.00 donation per class to the Airedale Terrier Health Fund. Not for Competition: £2.00 per dog (please provide details on entry form). Pre-paid Catalogues: £2.00 Members, £2.50 Non-Members (very limited number available on the day at £3.00). Advertisements: full page £8.00; half page £4.00 (B&W only). Membership: Single £5.00, Joint £7.00, Vice-President £12.00, Overseas £30.00.
6. There is no prize money on offer at this Show.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition. N.A.T.A. will accept Not for Competition entries for puppies over 4 months of age.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **Best Puppy in Show** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.
11. **Best in Show** Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

- Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**

17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
19. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
20. The Show will be held under Kennel Club Rules and Show Regulations. Every exhibitor making an entry or entries at this Show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by these Rules and Regulations and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
21. **DISCLAIMER:** The Committee of the Show can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stand holders at the Show and remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulation for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition F(B).
22. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This Regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).
23. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.
24. A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been: a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled Judge, this shall not apply to a Judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees.
25. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

## DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

*(The word "dog" includes both sexes)*

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Saturday, 23rd March 2019**. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) *Withdrawal*

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 20.

(2) *Transfer*

a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy

Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

**THE MILLIE TARPLEE MEMORIAL BEGINNERS** For dogs handled by exhibitor throughout the Show whose owner has not won a first prize at the Association's Shows. This class is open to both dog and bitch.

**MINOR PUPPY** For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

**PUPPY** For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

**JUNIOR** For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

**NOVICE** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

**UNDERGRADUATE** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 3 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy Classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

**POST GRADUATE** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**LIMIT** For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**OPEN** For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

**VETERAN** For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

**SPECIAL AWARD JUNIOR** For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

**SPECIAL AWARD POST GRADUATE** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**SPECIAL AWARD OPEN** For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

#### **ADVISORY NOTICE:**

**NOT FOR COMPETITION** Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

## DIRECTIONS

Leave the M1 at junction 22, then at roundabout take the exit onto the A50 (signposted Leicester). Continue for approximately 1.5 miles. At Field Head roundabout take the 3rd exit onto Launde Road, continuing forward to enter Markfield. You will pass the Islamic Centre on your left and Tomlinsons Boarding Kennels & Canine Centre will be found 100 yards further on the right.
