I owned my first Staffordshire Bull Terrier over 30 years ago, however I didn't start showing a Stafford until 2006 when I campaigned Jagsstaff St Elmo's Fire (Jack). He gained many wins including Best in Show at two Breed Club Open shows and 3 at General Open and Limit Shows, gaining his KC SBN along the way. He was a true showman and a loving family member. Jack gave me the show bug and sent me down the path to where I am today, he is missed dearly.

I bred my first litter 9 years ago, having bred 5 litters in total. Out of these, several pups have gone on to have great success in the showing both in the U.K. and abroad. Three attaining Multi Champion and Champion titles in the USA, Russia and Finland and I have also been fortunate to have campaigned one of my own to her U.K. Champion title, Champion Seenworstaff Tea

For Two. Three others, Seenworstaff Stand By Me, Seenworstaff Storm Warning at Joemikeste and Seenworstaff True Grit For Janikastco have also gained their KC SBN along with CCs and RCCs.

I started judging 6 years ago and to date I have had the privilege to judge over 200 Staffords, at 17 shows around the country enjoying each and every opportunity. I have attended and passed all KC required exams and seminars and always strive to judge honestly, fairly and to the breed standard giving each exhibit the same consideration.

I am honoured to have been asked to judge at the NESBTC where I am a serving officer, I thank all those who voted giving me this opportunity and I look forward to judging our fabulous breed again.

I have been around Staffords for many years, getting my first in 1997, a little red bitch called Ragen. Having been bitten by the Stafford bug, I obtained the affix Northstaff and got my second Stafford, who was Tia aka 'Jayenze justright' via Northstaff in 1998 then Dyer aka 'Jayenze JeordieBoy' via Northstaff in 2000. After experiencing the showing, mating and breeding process of such an outstanding breed, I fell in love with the Stafford. I then had a few years out due to family commitments and rescuing my Bulldog called "mavis".

I returned to the breed show scene in 2012, when I was privileged to own 'Bullhawk Jessie Jay at Northstaff'. I have trained and condition this bitch since she was a pup and she has won at numerous Limited, Open, Championship Shows gaining ICC and a Reserve CC. She has also been honoured to represent the UK team in Holland twice. I gained two RCCs with Ginstean Black Bomber and have also shown and gained Stud Book number with American Champion Samross American Dream. I have bred and am currently showing Northstaff Notorious.

I feel that I have learned an awful lot about our fantastic breed through friends around the show ring and listening to the experienced Stafford folk amongst us and by being on the NESBTC committee I have attended breed seminars and have now judged twenty eight classes equalling 84 dogs. I have judged in Las Vegas 2018 and have appointments booked for 2018/19.

I would like to think I would be honest in my judging opinion with having no colour preference and be approachable as I am constantly trying to improve my knowledge of our amazing breed.

RULES and REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 10.00 am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time, but it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that exhibits are available for the judging of classes entered.
3. Judging will commence at 10.30 am; Special Awards will be judged during the lunch break.
4. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed by which time dogs must be removed. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed.
5. FEES. Entry Fee: £5.00 unlimited classes per dog. Veteran Classes: Free of Charge (Classes 8 & 16 ONLY). Not for Competition £2.00 per dog. Catalogues £2.00 pre-paid (*there may be a limited number of catalogues available on the day at £2.50*). Advertisements: £10.00. Trade Stands: £10.00. Membership: Single £4.00; Joint £5.00; Junior (under 16) FREE. Admission: Adults £3.00; Children accompanied by an Adult FREE; OAPs FREE.
6. There is no Prize Money on offer at this Show.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **Best Puppy in Show:** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.
11. **Best in Show:** Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**
17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted for Staffordshire Bull Terriers of four calendar months of age and over on the day of the Show. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
19. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
20. No animal other than a dog duly entered for the Show will be allowed within the precincts of the Show.
21. Every exhibitor making an entry at this Show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by the Kennel Club Rules & Show Regulations, and by these Regulations, and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
22. The Committee will not be responsible for the loss, detention or damage to any dog or other property whether arising from accident, or any other cause whatsoever, nor for any act or omission of themselves, their officers, agents, servants and others, and it is on this understanding only that entries are accepted.
23. Exhibitors may be asked by the Show Manager to stack their cages in the interest of safety.
24. Any bank charges incurred by dishonoured cheques will be passed on to the exhibitor concerned.
25. If acknowledgement of entries is required, a self-addressed stamped postcard should be sent with entries.
26. The Show Manager reserves the right to refuse admission to the Show.

Advisory Notes - Additional Rules and Regulations

1. Should any judge be prevented from fulfilling their engagement, the Committee reserves to themselves the right of appointing other judges to fulfil their duties. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be refunded.
2. Any owner, competitor or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.

3. The Committee will do its utmost to ensure the safety of the dogs brought for exhibition but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and all other persons at the Show that the Committee will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any dogs or property, or personal injury whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever.
4. An announcement prior to the date of closing of entries in Our Dogs of any alteration or addition made by the Committee to the schedule or in these Rules shall be sufficient notice thereof.
5. All children must be kept under control and parents will be held responsible for any damage caused and charges incurred.
6. Please do not obstruct gangways with trolleys. Storage space will be made available for trolleys/cages.
7. If in the opinion of the Show Secretary, Show Manager or Judge any dog is considered not in a fit state for exhibition owing to a disease, savage disposition, or any other cause, the dog may be excluded or removed from the show the dog must not be brought into the Show at any time under any circumstances. No animal other than an exhibit duly entered at the show will be allowed within the precincts of the show during its continuance.
8. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at a Kennel Club licensed event must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event)
9. A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge, this shall not apply to a judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of the appropriate entry fees.
10. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

Wins at Championship shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Monday, 13th May 2019.**

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- (1) *Withdrawal*
The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.
- (2) *Transfer*
 - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

SPECIAL OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

ADVISORY NOTICE

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club regulations to refuse any entry.
