I am hugely privileged to be invited to judge dogs at this year's North East Championship Show. I'm Gillian Mcdermott, with my husband we have the affix Macadermus. We have had Staffordshire Bull Terriers for the past 30 years, and my first judging appointment was an Open Show in 1995. I gave my first set of CCs at The Staffordshire Bull Terrier Club [the parent club], in November 2012, and in June 2013 I was given the honour to judge the Cork Staffordshire Bull Terrier Club in Southern Ireland, and in August of the same year Australia for the Staffordshire Bull Terrier Club of Queensland inc. I have judged The Norway Terrier Club and Finland SBT CLUB, and Darlington Canine Society Championship show UK in 2014. Judged the Czech Reb The SBT Club.

We campaigned Odins Nomad to a RCC and Stud Book Number; Araidh Stitch in Thyme to ICC, 1 RCC, and Res Green Star, Junior Warrant; Champion Knockon Halloween Queen to the title of Champion in 2000. We also campaigned Waystaff Dutch Chieftain, Macadermus Summer Lady to her Stud Book Number and had good results with Mccadermus Midnight Caller and Macadermus Dawn Run. At present we are campaigning Kings and Queens Over the Moon, she has her JW, Stud Book Number and 2 RCCs.

I have also judged other Terriers at Open Show level and at present am on the C list for Norfolk Terriers and Glen of Imaal Terriers.

I am honoured and delighted to have been given this appointment, and will give my honest and unbiased opinion, I hope the day will be a great success for the club and exhibitors.

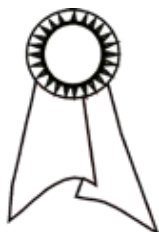

YOU ARE REQUIRED UNDER KENNEL CLUB RULES TO CLEAR UP ANY FOULING DONE BY DOG(S) IN YOUR CHARGE WITHIN THE ENVIRONS OF THE SHOW.

EXHIBITORS ARE REMINDED THAT IF THEY BRING CHILDREN TO THE SHOW THEY HAVE A RESPONSIBILITY TO KEEP THEM UNDER CONTROL. PLEASE ENSURE THAT THE VENUE IS NOT DAMAGED & THE ENJOYMENT OF THE SHOW BY FELLOW EXHIBITORS ARE NOT COMPROMISED BY THE BEHAVIOUR OF YOUR CHILDREN.

PLEASE **DO NOT** EXERCISE YOUR DOG OUTSIDE THE AREA PROVIDED.

SOFT CRATES: THE KENNEL CLUB HAS ASKED THAT WE DRAW ATTENTION TO THE POTENTIAL HEALTH & SAFETY IMPLICATIONS CONCERNING THE USE OF SOFT CRATES AS IN ITS VIEW, THEY DO NOT OFFER SUFFICIENT PROTECTION TO DOGS. THEY HAVE ASKED THAT WE POINT OUT THAT DOGS SHOULD NOT BE LEFT UNATTENDED IN THE SOFT CRATES. THERE HAVE BEEN INSTANCES WHERE DOGS HAVE ESCAPED FROM THOSE WHICH HAVE NOT BEEN SECURELY FASTENED TO BENCHES, OR THAT HAVE BEEN LEFT AT THE RINGSIDE. WE THEREFORE ASK THAT IF YOU USE SOFT CRATES, YOU DO NOT LEAVE THE DOGS UNATTENDED, WHETHER IN THE HALL, OR IN AN OPEN CAR IN THE CAR PARK.

EACH EXHIBITOR IS RESPONSIBLE FOR PROVIDING THEIR OWN CRATE OR CAGE IDENTIFICATION

Your dog is vulnerable & AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures & even on days considered slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club regulations to refuse any entry

RULES and REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 9.00 am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time, but it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that exhibits are available for the judging of classes entered.
3. Judging will commence at 10.00 am.
4. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed by which time dogs must be removed. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed.
5. FEES. Entry Fee: £15.00 per dog (any number of classes). **Veteran Classes:** £1.00 (Classes 11 & 22 ONLY). **Not for Competition:** £2.00 per dog (SBTs only, over 4 calendar months of age on the day of the Show). **Catalogues:** £3.00 pre-paid with entries (collected by 12.30 pm); there may be a limited number of catalogues available on the day at £3.50. **Membership:** Single £4.00; Joint £5.00; Junior (under 16) FREE. **Advertisements:** £10.00 per full page. **Rosette Sponsorship:** £3.00 per class. **Trade Stands:** £20.00 (to be pre-booked and paid for with the Show Secretary). **Admission at door:** Adults £3.00 (Senior Citizens and Children accompanied by an Adult FREE).
6. There is no Prize Money on offer at this Show.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **Best Puppy in Show**

Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.

11. **Best in Show**

Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.

12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F I I.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**
17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show
18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted for Staffordshire Bull Terriers of four calendar months of age and over on the day of the Show. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
19. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.

Advisory Notes – Additional Rules and Regulations

1. Should any judge be prevented from fulfilling their engagement, the Committee reserves to themselves the right of appointing other judges to fulfil their duties. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be refunded.
2. Any owner, competitor or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.
3. The Committee will do its utmost to ensure the safety of the dogs brought for exhibition but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and all other persons at the Show that the Committee will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any dogs or property, or personal injury whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever.
4. An announcement prior to the date of closing of entries in Our Dogs of any alteration or addition made by the Committee to the schedule or in these Rules shall be sufficient notice thereof.
5. All children must be kept under control and parents will be held responsible for any damage caused and charges incurred.
6. Please do not obstruct gangways with cages, pens, grooming tables, trolleys and dogs. Storage space will be made available for trolleys/ cages.
7. If in the opinion of the Show Secretary, Show Manager or Judge any dog is considered not in a fit state for exhibition owing to a disease, savage disposition, or any other cause, the dog may be excluded or removed from the show the dog must not be brought into the Show at any time under any circumstances.
8. No animal other than an exhibit duly entered at the show will be allowed within the precincts of the show during its continuance.
9. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at a Kennel Club licensed event must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event)
10. A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge, this shall not apply to a judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of the appropriate entry fees.
11. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Monday, 12th August 2019**.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) *Withdrawal*

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 20.

(2) *Transfer*

- a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

MAIDEN For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or a First Prize at an Open or Championship show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

NOVICE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

ADVISORY NOTICE

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

NOTICE FOR OVERSEAS EXHIBITORS

Frequently Asked Questions

Question: Can I enter a show while my Authority to Compete (ATC) is being processed?

Answer: *You may not enter any competitions in the UK until you have your ATC number, and this number must be quoted on all entry forms.*

Question: Can I enter a show prior to sending in the registration forms?

Answer: *You are not permitted to enter a show with either NAF or TAF, unless you have physically applied for a Name or Transfer.*

Question: Do overseas wins count when calculating eligibility for classes at UK Kennel Club licensed shows?

Answer: *In the class definitions, a Challenge Certificate (CC) includes any show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, therefore a Green Star, CAC and/or CACIB, when considering class eligibility, will be the equivalent of winning a CC. We would further advise that if the dog is a Champion, it will only be eligible to enter the Open Class unless it is eligible for a 'Special' or age restricted Class e.g. yearling where eligibility is based solely on age and not on awards). This applies to all UK Kennel Club licensed shows. The 'First Prizes' sections of the Class definitions refer to those First Prizes gained at UK Kennel Club licensed shows.*

Question: My dog is a Junior Champion. Does this count when calculating eligibility?

Answer: *The Kennel Club does not recognise the title of Junior Champion. However, exhibitors should take into account any award which we recognise which counts towards the title of Champion as it will be the equivalent to a Kennel Club Challenge Certificate (CC) e.g. CACs, CACIBs, Green Stars. If the dog has not been awarded a prize which counts towards the title of Champions then it has no previous CCs.*

Question: My dog is an overseas Champion. Can it enter an AV Champion Class?

Answer: *Yes. Dogs which have gained an overseas Champion title awarded by any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club are eligible to enter AV Champion Classes. However, exhibitors should check the Show Schedule as some definitions, specified by the Show Society, may state otherwise.*
