• OUR JUDGES •

Dogs - Graham Atkins (Snikkles)

I have been involved in Beardies since 1976 showing under the Labooshar affix, having some success with a Beardie from the late Maureen Reader (Tamevalley) making up Ch.Tamevalley Folk Lyric who produced from her first litter Ch. Labooshar Lore Lord.

Under the new Snikkles affix we campaigned Ch. Kelham Hot Gossip JW (Rosie) to her title and Coalacre Cruisin to Snikkles JW (2CC). From this mating Carol and I are currently showing two litter mates with some success. Ch. Snikkles Sea Lavender JW gained his UK JW at 12 months old and also qualified for the prestigious Pet Plan Junior Stakes final in 2009 and in 2010 won a Res CC at SCBCC from Yearling plus a first at Crufts 2010.

I have awarded CCs since 1992 and have judged on numerous occasions in the UK and Europe, and once a Club show in Australia. Recent judging included the Euro Show in Belgium (2007), a Club show in Holland (bitches) 2008 and in 2009 Crufts (dogs).

I am looking for a Beardie that can do a day's work and is constructionally sound with a happy temperament, who enjoys the day with its owner.

Bitches - Robert Ballantyne (Bustroc)

I have owned Beardies since 1983, started showing in 1984 and have been hooked on showing ever since. Over the years I have made up four UK Champions as well as breeding several Stud Book qualifiers and Junior Warrant winners. My lovely dogs were also Top Beardies in 1997 (Ch. Potterdale Chancellor) and in 2006/2007 (Ch Bustroc Drouthie Cronie JW).

I first judged our lovely breed in 1988, awarding CCs for the first time in 2000. I have also been lucky enough to judge our breed abroad on many occasions. I also award CCs in Old English Sheepdogs. At present I am Chairman of the Bearded Collie Club (Scottish Branch) and breed representative on the committee of Scottish Breeds

I consider it an honour to have been given the opportunity to judge this Club show by its members.

Best in Show Judge - Cath Parker (Osmart)

I have been owned by Beardies for over 50 years, these have included CC winners, reserve CC winners, stud book entries and one who was kept purely as a house dog and companion. In the early years I preferred to own dogs including Ch Bravo of Bothkennar and Ch Osmart Bonnie Blue Braid who both ensured their place in the history of the breed. During these years I have owned less than 10 Beardies and have bred less than 10 litters, which may surprise some of the newer exhibitors, but I have always though quality more important that quantity. In my younger days I handled many of the resident Osmarts at local and championship shows, prior to my mother's (Jenny Osborne) death I tended to be the one left at home to take care of the kennels on show days with my daughter carrying out the majority of the handling. Now we have fewer dogs, it is possible for me to be more active both attending shows with Robynne along with assisting and supporting her in ensuring the future of Osmart.

I first awarded CCs in 1976 and have judged on many occasions including Breed Club Open and Championship Shows and the bitch classes at Crufts 1992. Overseas judging has included Club and Championship Shows in Canada, Denmark, Sweden and Germany with a club match in America

In addition, I have been showing Skye Terriers since 1968 with some success including CC winners, reserve CC winners and stud book entries. I have been awarding CCs within this breed since 1986 and appointments have included the Breed Club Open, Championship Shows and Crufts 1997.

RULES and REGULATIONS

- 1. The Show will open at 9.00 am.
- 2. Dogs will be received at any time after the opening of the show but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that dogs are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging will commence at 10.00 am in both rings.
- 4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
- 6. Entry Fees: Members: First Entry per dog £18.00; each subsequent entry with same dog £3.00. Non-Members: First entry per dog £23.00; each subsequent entry with same dog £4.00. Veteran/Special Vintage: Free of Charge to Members, £5.00 to Non-members. Junior Handling: Free of charge. Not for Competition: £2.00 per dog (over 4 calendar months of age). Catalogues: £3.00 pre-paid with entries (£4.00 on the day). Advertisements: £5.00 Full Page; £3.00 Half Page. UK Membership: £9.00 Single; £10.00 Joint. Rosette Donations: £3.50 per class.
- Prize money will be on offer for class winners (further details will be in the catalogue).
- 8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
 11. Best Puppy in Show Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.

Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.

Withdrawal from other Competition: Puppies which become eliqible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate, in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.

Proviso: For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.

12. Best in Show The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which had competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.

Withdrawal from other Competition: Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.

Proviso: For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.

- 13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 14. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- It is not acceptable to handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. Exhibitors should note that such practices could constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 16. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 17. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 18. Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic iams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

- 19. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- 20. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.
- 21. No animal, other than an exhibit duly entered at the Show, will be allowed within the precincts of the Show during in continuance.
- 22. No Exhibitors passes will be sent, Any exhibitor wishing acknowledgement of entry must enclose a stamped addressed envelope...
- 23. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserve the right to appoint another judge.
- 24. In the event of the show having to be abandoned, the Committee reserve the right to deduct from the entry fees paid, such amount as is necessary
- 25. Exhibitors whose cheques are returned by their bank for any reason will be liable to pay the amounts due, plus any bank charges incurred.
- The committee is empowered to exclude or remove any dog which in the opinion of a Veterinary Surgeon is not in a fit state for exhibition owing to illness, disease, or vice or any other cause. Exhibitors are reminded that they are responsible for all veterinary fees incurred in respect of their dogs.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(N.B. The word 'dog' includes both sexes)

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. Saturday, 30th December 2017.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- (1) Withdrawal
 - The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 21.
 -) Transfer
 - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

MAIDEN For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First Prize at an Open or Championship show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

NOVICE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

DEBUTANT For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First Prize at a Championship Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy, Special Puppy Classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 4 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

MID LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the KC, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 5 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where CCs were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL VINTAGE For dogs of not less than ten years of age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL OPEN For dogs who have been scored under the BVA/KC Hip Dysplasia Scheme. Winners must confirm their scores at time of entry and all scores will be published in the catalogue.

SPECIAL STUD DOG For Stud dogs and at least 3 progeny of which only the progeny must be entered and exhibited in a breed class at the Show.

SPECIAL BROOD BITCH For Brood bitches and at least 3 progeny of which only the progeny must be entered and exhibited in a breed class at the Show.

ADVISORY NOTICE

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed. Puppies of 4 - 6 months can be entered 'Not for Competition' at Club Shows. Any puppies within the precincts of the show found to be under 4 months of age OR any dog present that has not been entered NFC will be asked to leave. Abuse of the 4 months rule will result in this privilege being removed.

PHOTOGRAPHS - Photographs may be taken at this event. These may appear on our Website or in our publications. Any other use is out of the control of the Club. No responsibility for the use of these pictures, still or moving can be taken. Any concerns must be taken up with the photographer in question.
