On-line entry is preferred to avoid handling paper. PLEASE do your utmost to enter this way wherever possible.

Any attendees not listed in the catalogue will be asked to complete the track and trace sheet at the Secretary's desk.

All catalogues to be pre-paid and there will be none available to purchase on the day.

"Not before" times to be announced on SDCA Facebook Group Page three days prior to the event (21st October).

There will be no exhibitor chairs inside and no gathering ringside. Only classes taking part at that time will be permitted in the show area.

Face coverings to be worn whilst exhibiting and any time whilst indoors.

The entrance/exit will be divided for entering and exiting the building.

Trolleys and crates may be permitted inside the venue at the discretion of the committee as it will depend on the socially distanced room available on the day, but we cannot guarantee this. Preference will be given to long coated breeds.

There will be a collecting ring prior to each class and an overflow ring if classes need to be split.

Exhibitors are kindly requested to leave the centre once their judging is completed.

Rings will have separate entry and exit points and there will be an overflow ring if the judge wishes to split and move separately.

Extra experienced show helpers on hand to ensure social distancing and smooth operation.

The toilets will be one person use at all times.

The barn is well ventilated with open doors and a high ceiling to allow good ventilation.

There will be sanitiser at various stations.

All exhibitors must ensure they remain socially distanced from other exhibitors whilst in the ring and at all times; rings will be marked with distancing markers.

The judge will sanitise hands after assessing each dog.

The handler will show the dog's teeth to the judge.

The table, when used, will be wiped by the steward with appropriate wipes between each dog.

Separate tables will be provided for the judge and the steward/s to assist with social distancing.

Certificates/rosettes and ring numbers will be laid out, on a separate table, in advance of judging and the exhibitors are requested to collect them before and after each class to minimise contact.

Any prize money will be available in envelopes with the awards.

Miniature Dachshunds will not be weighed and dogs will not be measured.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

Wins at Championship shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Monday**, **21st September 2020**.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) Withdrawal

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F.(1).19.

(2) Transfer

- a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. **POST GRADUATE** For dogs which have not won five or more First Prizes at Championship and Open Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY STAKES For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR STAKES For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

OPEN STAKES For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show. **SPECIAL YEARLING** For dogs of six and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

ANY VARIETY NOT SEPARATELY CLASSIFIED For breeds of dog for which no separate breed classes are scheduled.

IMPORTED BREED REGISTER For breeds confined to the Imported Breeds Register and only when an Interim Breed Standard has been published by the Kennel Club. Such breeds may be exhibited in this class only, with the winning dog being eligible for Best in Group / Best Puppy in Group or Best in Show / Best Puppy in Show as relevant.

ADVISORY NOTICE

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

RULES & REGULATIONS •

- 1. The Show will open at 9.30 am (due to insurance liability there will be strictly no entry before 9.30 am).
- Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging will commence at 10.00 am.
- 4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5. Entry Fee: £4.50 first entry per dog; £1.50 each subsequent entry with the same dog (excluding Stakes Classes). Stakes Classes: £3.00 per class. Not for Competition: £1.00 per dog. Catalogues: £3.00 pre-paid with entries ONLY (none available on the day). Membership: £3.00 Single; £4.00 Joint (if you are not already a member, membership fees must be paid with your entry and will carry forward to 31st January 2021). Rosette Donation: £1.00.
- Prize Money is on offer as follows: BIS £20.00; RBIS £10.00; BPIS £15.00; RBPIS £10.00; BVIS £15.00; Stakes Classes: 1st £5.00; 2nd £3.00; 3rd £2.00.
- 7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 10. Best Puppy in Show: Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show respectively.
- 11. Best in Show: The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and has been declared Best of Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified and Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register.

Best in Show and subsequent placings must be selected from:

- a. Those dogs declared Best of Breed.
- b. The dog declared Best from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each Group or on each day.
- c. The dog declared Best from the Any Variety Imported Breed Register class or classes in each Group or on each day.
- 12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Group or Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them <u>nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move</u>. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 15. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 16. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all

- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

- 17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
- 18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- 19. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- 20. The Committee is empowered to exclude or to remove any dog which is not in a fit state for exhibition from disease, vice, natural or other causes, and if such exclusion takes place either before or after the dog is judged the entrance fee will be forfeited.
- 21. The Committee will be most anxious for the safety and care of the dogs sent for exhibition and any property entrusted to it, but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and purchasers of dogs and all other persons that the Committee will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss or detention of or damage to dogs or any other property whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever, or from any act or omission of themselves, their officers, servants, agents or others and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
- 22. No animal other than an exhibit duly entered at the Show will be allowed within the precincts of the Show during its continuance.
- 23. No acknowledgement of receipt of postal entries will be sent unless a stamped, addressed postcard is enclosed with entries.
- 24. The Committee of the Show can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stand holders at the Show and remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition F(B).
- 25. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.
- 26. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This Regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).
- 27. A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been: a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled Judge, this shall not apply to a Judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees.
- 28. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.
- 29. Please note in event of cancellation/postponement of the show £4.00 will be retained from every entry refunded to cover administration costs.
