INTRODUCING OUR JUDGES

Dogs — Miss P. Whitehead (Ryallcourt)

I have been surrounded by an assortment of animals all my life. Horses, 2 or 3 dogs (now several more!), the occasional litter, ducks, chickens and the odd cat. During my youth, I spent the summer months travelling the length and breadth of the country with Show Ponies, and the winters preparing Hunters, one of which belonged to the Queen's cousin. I had a Thoroughbred Mare at home, purely for pleasure.

My Mother has had several breeds of dogs over the years – Poodles, Basset Hounds and Labradors. In 1986, a blue roan Cocker Spaniel bitch of Coltrim breeding joined us. Bluebell was not bred from or exhibited at Championship level, as she was not considered a good enough example of the breed, but she more than made up for that in personality. My interest in the breed and exhibiting was sparked by her and became a total commitment.

Sh Ch Ryallcourt Pie In The Sky, my first Champion, took the CC at Crufts in 2000, and then the Gundog Group at East of England Championship Show. Ryallcourt Bollinger and Sh Ch Ryallcourt Causing Chaos started my fascination with black and whites and colour genetics. Sh Ch Ryallcourt Pied Piper was a special friend to the end. The highlight for me was handling my homebred Sh Ch Ryallcourt Moloh to BIS at The Cocker Spaniel Club's Championship Show in 2012.

Although I have only kept parti-coloured Cockers, I have a soft spot for blacks and goldens. I think that would double my numbers, but one day, maybe!

I feel honoured to have been voted for by the Club members to judge Dogs at the Championship Show in 2019. I look forward immensely to this appointment.

Bitches — Mr D. Shapland (Deracor)

After buying our first Cocker in 1976 from the Classicway kennel, my wife Coral and I have been involved with the dog showing world ever since. We have had some success in the show ring and have won 2 CCs and four Res CCs with different dogs over the years, five Junior Warrant winners and 26 Stud Book numbers. My judging career started at The Dorset County Open Show in the early 1980s. I first awarded Challenge Certificates in Cocker Spaniels at The City of Birmingham Championship show in 1991. BOB was Lindridge Salute who made up on the day and went on to win the Gundog Group. Since then I have been lucky enough to award CCs on several occasions in the UK. Additionally, I have judged in Australia, USA, The Netherlands, Germany, Belgium, Serbia, Sweden and Ireland. I have also had the honour to have judged the Dogs at Crufts 2018 and was thrilled to see my BOB Sh Ch Veratey Vincenzo at Cassom gain Group 2 in the Gundog Group. Having retired as Secretary of The Cocker Spaniel Club after twelve years, in 2017, I was able to stand for consideration to be elected as a judge at the Cocker Club Championship show 2019. Thank you to every one of our members who have made this possible. I am so looking forward to this prestigious appointment.

• RULES and REGULATIONS •

1. The Show will open at 8.00 am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 9.00 am.
4. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed by which time dogs must be removed. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. Exhibits may not be removed any earlier unless by written order of the Veterinary Surgeon, Veterinary Practitioner or of the Show Management and then only in very exceptional and unforeseen circumstances which must be reported to the Kennel Club.
5. Entry Fees: Members First entry per dog £17.00; Non-Members First entry per dog £20.00; each subsequent entry with the same dog £3.00; Not For Competition £10.00 per dog. Catalogues: Pre-paid with entries £4.50, at the Show £5.00. Membership: Single £12.00; Joint £15.00; Overseas £25.00.
6. Prize Money is on offer in Classes 51 & 52 as follows: 1st £15.00; 2nd £10.00; 3rd £5.00; Reserve £3.00; VHC £2.00.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **Best Puppy in Show:** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.
11. **Best in Show:** Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**
17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars,

is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.

18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
19. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
20. The Show will be held under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. All dogs must be registered or transferred at the Kennel Club at the time of entry.
21. Committee reserve to themselves the right to refuse, on reasonable grounds, any entries they may think fit; to exclude or remove any dog not in a fit state for exhibition either from disease, vice, natural or any other cause, and if such exclusion takes place either before or after the dog has been judged the entrance fee will be forfeited.
22. No animal, other than a dog duly entered at the Show, will be allowed within the precincts of the Show during its continuance.
23. **PASSES WILL NOT BE SENT OUT.** If receipt of entry is required please enclose a stamped, addressed postcard with your entries.
24. Should a Judge be unable to fulfil his appointment, the Committee reserve the right to appoint another in his place in which case exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be returned.
25. The Judge will be instructed and empowered to withhold any Prize in any class if, in his opinion, the dog does not possess sufficient merit. The Judge is not empowered to give Prizes beyond those offered in the Schedule. The Judge's decision shall be final except in the case of fraud or misrepresentation or where a bona fide mistake has been made by the Judge.
26. The Committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of exhibits and exhibitors but it must be distinctly understood by all persons attending the Show that the Committee will not be held responsible for the loss, detention or of damage to any dog or property, whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever, or by any act or omission of themselves, their officers, agents, servants or others.
27. All Rules, Regulations, Definitions or instructions in the nature of Rules and Regulations printed for convenience in other parts of this Schedule shall be deemed to be the Regulations of the Committee and shall have the same effect as if they formed a part of these Regulations.
28. Every exhibitor making an entry or entries at this Show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Kennel Club and of this Show Committee. It is on this understanding only that entries are received.
29. The Committee of the Show can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stand holders at the Show and remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
30. May we remind exhibitors that they are responsible for clearing up any fouling made by dogs in their charge, whether it be inside the hall or outside. Anyone failing to clear up will be reported to the Committee who may enforce the right to refuse entries from that exhibitor for future Shows.
31. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This Regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).
32. A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been: a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled Judge, this shall not apply to a Judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees.
33. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

• DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES •

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Tuesday, 11th June 2019**

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- (1) *Withdrawal*

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 20.

(2) *Transfer*

- a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

MAIDEN For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or a First Prize at an Open or Championship show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

NOVICE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

TYRO For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

MINOR LIMIT For dogs which have not won two Challenge Certificates/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or three or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL BRACE For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team.

SPECIAL BEGINNERS For exhibit and exhibitor who have never won a Challenge Certificate; exhibit to be handled by the owner.

SPECIAL OPEN Similar to Open except that it is restricted as to colour, as stated in the Classification.

SPECIAL PROGENY For a dog or bitch, accompanied by at least three of its registered progeny (maximum five). The dog or bitch not necessarily entered in another class however, all progeny having been entered and exhibited in another class. The dog or bitch and the progeny need not be registered in the same ownership.

ADVISORY NOTICE

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.
