OUR JUDGES

Cesar Cortes (*Londoncor*)

From the age of 11 Cesar has been involved with dogs and at the age of 18 he travelled to study in the UK where he became involved with Cavaliers. On his return to Columbia he took home a Cavalier that became the first Cavalier to win an all breed BIS in South America. At the moment he co-owns the Londoncor CKCS and they have bred and owned several Champions in North and South America, Finland, the UK and World Winners. In 2014 one of their Cavaliers became the top Cavalier in the UK, winning a BIS at an all breeds Championship Show.

Cesar has judged Toys extensively throughout the UK and awards CCs in Cavaliers and Italian Greyhounds. He is looking forward to judging in Norfolk and thanks the Committee for inviting him.

Roger Bathurst (*Auldlyn*)

Roger has owned Shetland Sheepdogs since 1974, first judging them in 1984 and awarding CCs in 1998. He judges most breeds within the Pastoral and Working Groups and has judged throughout the UK and Holland. His most recent highlight was judging Shelties at Crufts 2017. Roger is looking forward to having a nice day among the Sheltie fraternity.

Jen Sturch (*Frostynights*)

Jen has owned Siberian Huskies now for over 12 years, keeping a small kennel of 12 Huskies ranging from 18 months to 12 years. Bred her first litter in 2016 and has been a member of the Siberian Husky Club for over 10 years. Jen starting judging in 2015, her purpose to maintain the KC breed standard dual purpose Siberian Husky.

Thomas West (*Tomlyndon*)

Thomas has been showing Terriers since the age of nine, and to date has had four Champions. He shows and judges across Europe and has made up three International Champions. His current exhibit has a total of 31 CCs and is a Champion in Denmark, Sweden and Norway, and also won the Terrier Group at Paignton last year. Thomas awards CCs and judges all Terriers at Open Show level.

Dr Ian H. Gabriel (*Gaybryl*)

Ian is the third generation of his family to be involved with dogs and dog shows. He awards CCs in both Wire and Smooth Fox Terriers. He grew up with Gundogs and the kennel bred a Champion Curly Coated Retriever and thus fostered a deep interest in all Gundog breeds, both show and field. Ian has judged Hound and Gundog Groups throughout the UK on many occasions and has a deep interest in all breeds.

Ed Casey (*Moyglass*)

Ed started showing dogs aged 13 with Dalmatians, his first bitch became a Champion with many more to follow, including Ireland's top winning Dalmatian ever. Since moving to the UK Ed has been involved with all Gundogs, mainly Weimaraners, American Cockers and English Springer Spaniels.

Carolyn Boddington (*Kitesover*)

Carolyn is on the judging list of the Eastern Bearded Collie Club and has attended all breed specific seminars; she started judging in 1995 more recently in 2016. She has had Beardies since 1977 but it wasn't until 1988 that she was hooked on the show scene. After a break to raise her family she soon got back on the scene with her Beardies gaining stud book numbers, a Reserve CC and Best of Breed at Crufts in 2013. Carolyn has also been involved with Obedience and Agility since 1977.

Peter Sewell (*Lewarne*)

Peter has been involved with Rough and Smooth Collies since the early 80s, and was for many years a committee member of both the London Collie Club and the Smooth Collie Club of Great Britain. Peter has judged several breed club shows for both Rough and Smooth Collies and shows his commitment to dog shows by stewarding as often as he can at all the major Championship Shows including Crufts.

Simon Luxmoore (*Hushwing/Zima*)

Simon was brought up with dogs, Boxers, Elkhounds and Basset Hounds. The kennel has had Siberian Huskies since 1981 and at the moment has eight, along with two German Wirehaired Pointers. Simon lives on 7,500 acres of farmland allowing him to work the Siberians in harness which as always been a passion. Under the Zima and Hushwing affixes winning 126 'big green cards'. Simon has bred and owned many Champions, including the breed record holder Ch Zima Toaki who was BOB at Crufts on two occasions. Working on the trail between 1991 to 2007 have won many Championship titles. They ceased competition in favour and enjoyment of social training.

The dogs are shown sparingly these days due to Simon's canine commitments both as a Director and Chairman of the Kennel Club. Simon awards CCs in Siberian Huskies, Alaskan Malamutes, Basset Hounds and St Bernards, he is also on the judging lists for Beagles, Boston Terriers and French Bulldogs. Pauline and Simon live in Norfolk; Simon's day job is Chief Executive of the Royal Aeronautical Society based in London and he has held a number of non-executive directorships in the Aerospace Industry.

Pauline Luxmoore-Ball (*Hushwing/Zima*)

Pauline was brought up with Greyhounds and working Labradors, and along with her cousin had German Wirehaired Pointers and holds a separate interest in the small but successful Normba kennel. Pauline has had Siberian Huskies since 1992 and at the moment has eight plus two German Wirehaired Pointers. Living on 7,500 acres of open farmland allows Simon and Pauline to work their dogs from their garden. Working Sibes in harness has always been a passion although over the years we have won many 'big green cards' in the show ring. In 2007 Simon and Pauline decided to give up competition for the enjoyment of social training and exercise, this removed the pressure of attending races, and show sparingly these days due to canine commitments.

Pauline awards CCs in Siberian Huskies and Alaskan Malamutes, and this year has the honour of judging Canadian Eskimo Dogs at Crufts. She is also on the B List for Bernese Mountain Dogs and Lancashire Heelers, and C List for Australian Shepherds.

Pauline has been judging since 1990 and had judged some 40 breeds over the years.

Roberta Wright (*Satrebor*)

Roberta's first breed was Dobermanns in the early 70s; she had her first Akita in 1985 and also owned Soft Coated Wheaten Terriers. Roberta awards CCs in seven breeds: Akitas, Shar Pei, Boston Terriers, Schipperkes, Dobermanns, Alaskan Malamutes and Soft Coated Wheaten Terriers. Last year she judged her first Utility Group at the East of England Championship Show. Roberta is Chairman and Show Manager of the Akita Association,

• RULES AND REGULATIONS •

1. The Show will open at 9.00 am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 10.00 am.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. Exhibits may not be removed any earlier unless by written order of the Veterinary Surgeon or of the Show Management and then only in very exceptional and unforeseen circumstances which must be reported to the Kennel Club. The Show will close half an hour after all their judging has been completed.
5. **ENTRY FEES: Members** £6.00 first entry per dog; £2.00 each subsequent entry with the same dog. **Non-Members** £7.00 first entry per dog; £2.00 each subsequent entry with the same dog. **Not for Competition:** £2.00 per dog. **Catalogues:** £3.50 pre-paid with entries ONLY. **Membership:** Single £1.50; Joint £2.00 (*to run from the 1st January each year*).
6. Prize Money: Best in Show £25.00; Best Puppy in Show £20.00; Thetford Stakes Class: 1st £40.00; 2nd £20.00; 3rd £10.00; 4th £5.00; 5th £2.50.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **Best Puppy in Show:** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed, Best in Group or Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best of Breed, Reserve Best of Group or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed, Best in Group and Best in Show respectively. Best Puppy in Group and subsequent Group placings must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.
 - a) Those puppies declared Best Puppy in Breed.
 - b) The puppy declared Best Puppy from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each group or on each day.
 - c) The puppy declared Best Puppy from the Any Variety Imported Breed Register classes in each group or on each day.

11. **Best in Show:** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and has been declared Best of Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register.

a. Shows Judged on the Group System

(Definition: Shows judged on the Group System includes classes for breeds within more than one group, as defined in Kennel Club Regulation B(A); and require a judge to declare a best of each group after which the exhibits so declared will compete for the award of Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show.)

- 1) **Best of Breed:** Where a breed is separately classified a Best of Breed may be declared from those dogs which have received a first prize in a breed class at the show. Where separate classes are provided for each sex of a breed a Best of each Sex must be declared.
 - 2) **Best of Group:** Best of group and subsequent placings must be selected from:-
 - a) The Best of Breed winners in each group
 - b) The Best dog from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each group or on each day.
 - c) The puppy declared Best Puppy from the Any Variety Imported Breed Register classes in each group or on each day.
 - 3) **Best in Show:** Best in Show must be selected from the Best of Group winners. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Group winners following the selection for Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days:** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**

17. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
18. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
19. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.
20. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This Regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).

• DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES •

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Tuesday, 3rd July 2018.**

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) *Withdrawal*

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 20.

(2) *Transfer*

- a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

NOVICE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

THETFORD OPEN STAKES For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

CHAMPION For dogs which have been confirmed a Champion, show Champion or Field Trial Champion.

IMPORTED BREED REGISTER For breeds confined to the Imported Breeds Register and only when an Interim Breed Standard has been published by the Kennel Club. Such breeds may be exhibited in this class only, with the winning dog being eligible for Best in Group / Best Puppy in Group or Best in Show / Best Puppy in Show as relevant.

LINDA BLACKMORE MEMORIAL OPEN STAKES For all Shetland Sheepdogs for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

ANY VARIETY NOT SEPARATELY CLASSIFIED For Breeds of dog for which no separate breed classes are scheduled.

ADVISORY NOTICE

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.
